Enclosed is Amendment No. 41 to your NRC Material License No. 21-10459-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

We were unable to remove Items Nos. 6.A, 7.A, 8.A, and 9.A, from your NRC Material License as requested in your letter dated January 13, 2011 due to insufficient information provided. Leak test records were not submitted for Texas Nuclear (Thermo Measure Tech) Model 5190 gauge as requested in our letter addressed to you dated January 14, 2011. Please provide this information if you would like to pursue this request by addressing it to my attention as "additional information to control number 574259."

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 Code of Federal Regulations 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability. 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
