Purpose: to discuss the need to reinitiate section 7 consultation for the American crocodile as a result of the proposed extended power uprate at Turkey Point. Turkey Point's current biological opinion was issued May 5, 2006, and a modification to this biological

opinion was issued August 1, 2006.

Call Summary: NRC contacted John Wrublik to discuss whether the NRC should reinitiate section 7 consultation as a result of the proposed St. Lucie extended power uprate. Mr. Wrublik recommended that the NRC complete a biological assessment because the extended power uprate is a different action than continued operation, which is the action that was assessed during the 2006 consultation. Mr. Wrublik noted that the consultation could likely be informal and that a shortened or supplemental biological assessment would be appropriate as long as it covered the specifics of the extended power uprate and any updates to the crocodile population and monitoring since 2006. Mr. Wrublik also noted that FPL has been coordinating with FWS and the State to conduct studies on the crocodile population surrounding Turkey Point, which could provide valuable information to consider as part of the section 7 consultation.
