MANAGEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN

- The FFD Committee met periodically to review the progress of the FFD program. No significant action required.
- QA audits were completed on contracted testing laboratories. No significant findings.
- Personnel changes were made at a collection facility to improve patient service and procedure compliance.

DATA ANALYSIS RESULTS/PROGRAM CHANGES IMPLEMENTED

- Based on the result of a QA audit, the computerized random date selection program was modified to increase the number of night shift and weekend tests.
- With only one positive random test in the first 18 months of program implementation (over 1000 random tests), the 100% level for random testing appears to be excessive. Consideration should be given to reduce the selection rate to 50%.

EVENTS REPORTED UNDER 10 CFR 26.73

A report was made on 4/10/91 noting that an individual tested positive for alcohol during scheduled work hours. The following action was taken:

- 1) The individual left site and the badge was inactivated.
- 2) An assessment was completed.
- 3) A follow-up counseling plan was established.
- 4) Follow-up testing was initiated.

Based on these actions, unescorted access was re-instated.

No further action has been required.
