Original / Former Use: Used by Health Physics Office for Liquid Scintillation Vial waste storage, biological radiological waste storage, and check-in point for radiological shipments - 1989; Root Cellar/Potato Cellar in 1907

Date of Construction: 1907 (Taken over by WRAMC in 1942)

Construction Materials: Concrete block; masonry walls, concrete foundation

Renovation Status: Never renovated, currently in process of renovation, currently being used as staging/storage area for former National Seminary Park building renovations
