The subject inspection report presents the findings of an inspection conducted at the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant by Messrs. W. J. Key and J. Schapker of your office. One item of noncompliance, identified as an infraction, was cited for which our response is given below.

INFRACTION: 10 CFR 50, Appendix B, Criterion II, requires the establishment of a program for indoctrination and training of personnel performing activities affecting quality as necessary to assure that suitable proficiency is achieved and maintained.

Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS) procedure, OQAP 13, Revision 1, Subsection 2.4, commits to Regulatory Guide 1.58 "Qualification of Nuclear Power Plant Inspection, Examination and Testing of Personnel" which endorses ANSI N45.2.6. Subsection 3.2.5, states, "Plant personnel performing inspections, examinations and testing activities shall be trained and qualified in accordance with Subsection 2.4. ANSI N45.2.6, Section 2.2, requires that each person who verifies conformance of work activities to quality requirements be certified by his employer as being qualified to perform his assigned work.

Contrary to the above, on May 15, 1980, during an inspection of ISI activities it was determined that no program or procedures were developed for qualifying and training of WPS plant maintenance quality control personnel.

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RESPONSE:

A training program has been developed and initiated for the qualification and training of Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS) Plant Maintenance Quality Control Personnel in accordance with WPS procedure OQAP, Section 13. We expect to have the documentation complete and up to date by October 1, 1980.
