ATTACHMENT

ITEM:

Technical Specification 6.8.1 states "Written procedures and administrative policies shall be established, implemented and maintained that meet the requirements and recommendations of Section 5.1 and 5.3 of ANSI N18.7-1972." Section 5.1 states, in part, "... written administrative policies shall be provided to control the issuance of documents, including changes, that prescribe activities affecting safety-related structures, systems or components..." and also that "These policies shall assure that documents, including revisions or changes, are reviewed for adequacy and approved for release by authorized personnel and are distributed to and used by the personnel performing the prescribed activity."

The Kewaunee Operational Quality Assurance Program requires in Part 3.3.2 of Section 5, Document Control, that procedures which are controlled by the list of current revisions shall include a current revision list.

Contrary to the above, the lists of effective pages in Surveillance Procedures SP-56-090, SP-47-062, SP-36-019, SP-47-010, and SP-36-014B were not up to date.

RESPONSE:

The above pages in the identified Surveillance Procedures were revised and brought up to date. Other Surveillance Procedures were reviewed for similar types of errors and updated as necessary. To reduce the likelihood of similar errors occurring in the future, the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant will purchase word processing equipment to utilize in the control of future procedure revisions. The evaluation of the equipment to provide word processing capability is currently in progress.
