Passage of this bill may constitute good public policy because it would require healthcare providers that administer injections take a safe injection training course approved by the Health Division to to attest that they have knowledge of and are in compliance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines concerning safe injection practices as a condition of the issuance or renewal of their license, registration or certificate which should help ensure that patients receive injections in a safe manner that avoids the transmission of disease.
