I request that the upcoming ACRS sub-committee meeting on State-of-the-Art Reactor Consequence Analyses (SOARCA) scheduled for November 16th be a closed meeting. The information to be discussed at the meeting is predecisional information. SOARCA is an iterative process and no results are final until all analyses are complete. The Commission directed that the preliminary SOARCA results should not be made publicly available but to wait until all the analyses are completed before releasing the results.

For the same reasons, I request that the full Committee meeting in December be also a closed meeting.

This matter has been discussed with our contact in OGC and we have OGC support for this approach.
