Reference: Proposed Amendment 124 to the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant Technical Specifications, from C. R. Steinhardt (WPSC) to Document Control Desk (NRC), dated April 21, 1994.

By this letter Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPSC) requests the withdrawal of Proposed Amendment 124 to the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant (KNPP) Technical Specifications (TS). The following is a brief description of the proposed amendment and the basis for the withdrawal.

The above reference proposed the addition of Sections TS 3.15 and TS 4.15 to the KNPP Technical Specifications. Those new sections described operability and surveillance requirements for the Steam Exclusion System. Requirements do not currently exist in the TS for the Steam Exclusion System at the KNPP.

Since the time of the submittal, several discussions regarding this issue have been held with various members of the NRC staff. Those discussions prompted us to revisit the necessity of a TS amendment versus a change to the KNPP Updated Safety Analysis Report (USAR), which would augment the section on steam exclusion. Upon further review, we have determined that it would be more appropriate to include this information in the USAR. Therefore, the information which had been submitted as proposed amendment 124 is being withdrawn and will be included in the next revision to the USAR. Based on the aforementioned discussions, and the safety evaluation prepared in support of the resultant USAR revision, it was determined that

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
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the USAR change does not constitute an unreviewed safety question and therefore prior NRC approval is not required. The USAR change will be processed accordingly, and reported in the subsequent Annual Operating Report.
