FITNESS FOR DUTY PROGRAM PERFORMANCE DATA PERSONNEL SUBJECT TO 10CFR26

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN

- A QA audit was completed on the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant Fitness For Duty Program which resulted in no significant findings.
- The Fitness For Duty working committee met once during this reporting period. Fitness For Duty Procedures were revised to incorporate several program changes.

DATA ANALYSIS RESULTS/PROGRAM CHANGES IMPLEMENTED

- During this reporting period, the responsibilities of the Fitness For Duty Program were merged with those of the Security/Access Authorization Group.
- After three full years of random testing (nearly 2500 tests), only two positive test results (both on contractors) occurred. This supports the industry's recommendation to reduce the selection rate to 50 percent.
