Dear Mr. Congel:

Enclosed is the final report for the October 18, 1989, exercise of the offsite radiological emergency response plans for the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant. The State of Wisconsin fully participated in the exercise, as well as the Counties of Kewaunee and Manitowoc. The Wisconsin Public Service Corporation partially participated in the exercise. The final report, dated October 22, 1990, was prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region V staff.

There were no deficiencies observed during the October 18, 1989, exercise. However, the exercise report identifies eight Areas Requiring Corrective Action. A schedule of corrective actions has been provided by the State of Wisconsin in response to the exercise weaknesses identified. A copy of the exercise report will be forwarded to the State of Wisconsin. Additional verification of corrective actions will be provided by FEMA Region V during the next exercise for the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant, now scheduled for September 23, 1991.

Based on the results of the October 18, 1989, exercise, the offsite radiological emergency response plans and preparedness at the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant are adequate to provide reasonable assurance that appropriate measures can be taken offsite to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of a radiological emergency at that site. Therefore, the Title 44 CFR, Part 350 approval of the offsite radiological emergency response plans and preparedness for the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant granted on June 14, 1985, continues to be in effect.
