Dear Mr. Hinyup:

This and the enclosed NRC Form 591M refer to the safety inspection conducted on May 24, 2011, at your facility in Marrero Louisiana. The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under the General License provisions contained in 10 CFR 150.20 as they relate to safety and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and conditions of the license.

Additionally, the inspector reviewed the licensee's corrective actions in response to the Confirmatory Action Letter (CAL-4-08-002) and Confirmatory Order (EA-08-0184) issued to CAN USA, Inc. dated June 18, 2008 and April 16, 2010 respectively. The CAL was issued as a result of inspection activities occurring June 12, 2008 and subsequent conference calls conducted June 12-17, 2008. The Order was issued as a result of a successful alternative dispute resolution (ADR) mediation conducted on March 9, 2010. Based on the review, the NRC verified that the licensee has complied with all the conditions of the CAL and the Confirmatory Order. NRC recognizes that the licensee was not able to develop an agreement with the offshore platform operators related to radiation safety and security as required by item 5 of the Order, but the licensee has developed an effective work around to this requirement. Platform operators are provided with information related to the radiation safety and security requirements that CAN USA must meet and they are asked to sign the pre-job checklist. A final exit briefing was conducted with your Radiation Safety Officer on July 13, 2011.

Within the scope of this inspection, no violations or deviations were identified; therefore, no response to this letter or the enclosed NRC Form 591M is required.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's document system (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/Adams.html>.
