Enclosed is Amendment No. 52 to your NRC Material License No. 13-01983-15 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

This also refers to the telephone conversations on June 16, 2011, between you and Andrew Welding and me concerning this amendment and certain authorizations the license appeared to be missing.

In our conversation it was agreed that authorization in Subitem No. 9 was missing for Items CC., DD., EE., and FF; Condition 12.G. was incomplete; and the "decay-in-storage" condition for waste materials was missing. All of these authorizations have been restored and rectified. As a result of adding the "decay-in-storage" condition as No. 21, the last condition of your license was renumbered to No. 22.


