Enclosed is Amendment No. 06 to your NRC Material License No. 13-32079-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In your correspondence to us dated May 6, 2011, you indicated that you wished to release for unrestricted use 7478 Shadeland Station Way, Indianapolis, Indiana.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys, which consisted exposure rate and contamination surveys of the lab area. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from 7478 Shadeland Station Way, Indianapolis, Indiana, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria.

Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for 7478 Shadeland Station Way, Indianapolis, Indiana band it is suitable for unrestricted use.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
