NRC hereby consents to the transaction as described in your letters dated January 27, 2011, March 10, 2011, and May 20, 2011.

In addition, we removed the location of use at 4100 Lake Drive, SE, Kentwood, Michigan from this license and concurrently added it to license no. 21-00243-06. We also changed the Radiation Safety Officer on this license to you.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
