Dear Mr. Thomas:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 11 to your NRC Material License No. 12-20175-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

We were unable to approve your request to remove Texas Nuclear Model No. 5184, IHC Holland Model No. 180, and Kay-Ray, Inc. Model No. 7064P from your NRC Materials License. Before we can remove these materials from your license, we need the latest leak test results for all the gauges that you possessed under this license with these model numbers. We also need confirmation that none of these devices leaked while in your possession. Lastly we will need signed and dated acknowledgements of receipt for the gauges that you transferred along with a copy of the NRC or Agreement State Licenses of the transferees that received these gauges.

We are also unable to approve Mr. Wire as person who is able to mount and dismount devices until we receive documentation that shows he was trained in accordance with the training required by your application dated April 20, 2006.

Please note we removed License Condition No. 22 as it appeared in Amendment No. 10. You are authorized to mount and dismount gages in accordance with License Condition No. 16 which the license condition that we removed did not allow. We apologize for any inconvenience that this error may have caused. Subsequent license conditions were renumber as the result of this change.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 Code of Federal Regulations 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

The enclosed document contains sensitive security-related information.


