

"Overall integrated leakage rate" means the leakage rate which obtains from a summation leakage through all potential leakage paths. Including containment welds, valves, fittings, and components that penetrate containment.

NRC GENERIC LETTER 2011-XX: ADDRESSING LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE JAPANESE NUCLEAR POWER PLANT ACCIDENTS CAUSED BY THE MARCH 11, 2011 EARTHQUAKE

#### **ADDRESSEES**

All holders of operating licenses for nuclear power reactors, including those who have permanently ceased operations but have irradiated nuclear fuel stored onsite, and all applicants for construction permits for new nuclear power reactors.

#### **PURPOSE**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is issuing this generic letter (GL) to address issues identified as a result of the Japanese nuclear power plant accidents caused by the March 11, 2011 earthquake and subsequent tsunami. Specifically, the NRC is issuing this GL for three purposes:

- (1) to request addressees to submit information that describes the realistic capability of their nuclear power plants and fuel storage facilities to withstand an earthquake and potential associated phenomena
- (2) to request addressees to describe plans for enhancing their capability
- (3) to collect the requested information to determine if additional regulatory action is required

Pursuant to Title 10 Section 50.54(f) of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR 50.54(f)), addressees are required to submit a written response to this GL.

## **TAXXXXXXXX**

#### BACKGROUND

Brief discussion of the accident and purpose.

#### APPLICABLE REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

Look at backfit rule and anything else that takes us beyond the design basis and Appendices A and B. Ditto 10 CFR 50.63 and whether it should be re-interpreted?

#### DISCUSSION

Start with ultimate heat sink and walk through the heat removal paths. Include need for electricity.

Include discussion about differences between BWR and PWR containments, as well as differences between BWR/PWR SBO mitigation strategies.

Examine potential mechanisms that could cause loss-of-fuel storage pool water inventory such as when a fuel storage pool is configured for fuel transfer.

The enclosure to this GL, "Technical Considerations for Enhancing Capability to Withstand Seismic Events," provides additional information. Addressees should consider this information when preparing responses to this GL. Furthermore, the NRC staff plans to use this information during activities that are being planned as a follow-up to this GL.

#### **REQUESTED ACTIONS**

The NRC requests that each addressee (1) realistically evaluate the ability of its nuclear power plants and nuclear fuel storage facilities to withstand a seismic event and potential ensuing phenomena such as a tsunami, dam rupture, seiche, or debris that affects water intake structures and dry fuel cask cooling and, (2) suggest practical means to enhance response to seismic events.

#### REQUESTED INFORMATION

The NRC requests that each addressee provide the following information: (a) A description of the results of evaluations that were performed pursuant to the above requested actions; (b) a description of all corrective actions that you identified, including plant, programmatic, procedure, and modifications; (c) a statement regarding which corrective actions were completed and the schedule for completing corrective actions that you plan to complete; and (d) a brief discussion of identified corrective actions that you do not plan to pursue that includes the reasons for not pursuing that action further.

#### **REQUIRED RESPONSE**

In accordance with 10 CFR 50.54(f), an addressee must respond as described below.

Within three months of the date of this GL, each addressee is requested to submit a written response consistent with the requested actions and information.

The required written response should be addressed to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, MD 20852, under oath or affirmation under the provisions of Section 182a of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and 10 CFR 50.54(f). In addition, addressees should submit a copy of the response to the appropriate regional administrator.

#### REASONS FOR INFORMATION REQUEST

The NRC is requesting this information to support an NRC reexamination of the capability of United States nuclear facilities to withstand seismic events in light of the experience related to the seismic-related nuclear power plant accidents in Japan that initiated on March 11, 2011.

#### **BACKFIT DISCUSSION**

Under the provisions of Section 182a of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, this GL requests information applicable to establishing the realistic capability of withstanding seismic events and preventing a release of radioactive material that would be detrimental to public health and safety. No backfit is either intended or approved by the issuance of this GL. Therefore, the NRC staff has not performed a backfit analysis.

#### FEDERAL REGISTER NOTIFICATION

A notice of opportunity for public comment on this GL was published in the *Federal Register* (xx FR xxxxx) on XXXX. The NRC received XX sets of comments. The NRC staff considered all comments that were received. The NRC staff's evaluation of the comments is publicly available through the NRC's ADAMS under Accession No. TAXXXXXXXXXX.

# Technical Considerations for Enhancing Capability to Withstand Seismic Events

One objective of this generic letter (GL) is to identify practical improvements that may be implemented in operating or advanced reactors and on-site irradiated fuel storage facilities. The NRC believes this can be accomplished by reasonable practice and in many cases by not requiring criteria as typically applied to safety related equipment or the single failure requirement.

The NRC has identified several potential candidates that it suggests addressees consider when responding to this GL. This list is not complete, some of the candidates may not be practical, some of the candidates may not apply to individual addresses, and addressees will likely identify other candidates.

- 1. Alternate alternating current (AC) source defined in 10 CFR 50.2
  - a. Location with respect to protection from seismic and tsunami events
  - b. Capability to move and connect the alternate AC source assuming sufficient damage to the plant and environment to cause a station blackout due to a seismic event followed by a tsunami
  - c. Post-event refueling and other maintenance of the alternate AC source
- 2. Modifications to buildings containing equipment useful or required for long-term cooling
  - a. Improvements in seismic response capability
  - b. Improvements in resistance to short term flooding associated with a tsunami
    - (1) Elevate building ventilation openings
    - (2) Elevate diesel engine intake and exhaust openings
    - (3) Provide water resistant doors and seals
- Install battery driven ignitors in the upper level of boiling water reactor (BWR) secondary containments and pressurized water reactor (PWR) fuel storage pool buildings. Install such ignitors in any other locations where hydrogen may accumulate in sufficient quantity to be of potential concern.
- 4. Install fuel storage pool water makeup capability via an external connection similar to the Sizewell Unit 3 installation.
- 5. Install a spray system to cool fuel in the fuel storage pool if the pool is damaged and water level cannot be maintained above the top of the stored fuel.
- 6. Provide in-depth fuel storage pool cooling and makeup capability.
- 7. Provide additional dry storage facility protection against loss of natural circulation cooling due to debris or flooding.
- 8. Provide 72 hour standby battery power to extend station blackout capability.

The sites that have ceased operations and certified removal of fuel from the RV, but with fuel remaining in SFPs were excluded from the ICM Order, subsequent license conditions, and 10 CFR 50.54(hh)(2) because of the long decay time of the fuel that had been removed. We may wind up addressing them in a future generic comm., but the intent here had been to rapidly get the word out to current operating licensees on the events and their current requirements. We had included the chronology for the mitigating strategies requirements in order to clarify that they cover natural phenomena. I'll check again w/ the folks here to see if they feel a change to the purpose is warranted.

To our knowledge, there have not been any structural modifications made to the U.S. containments. However, the staff has assurance of the structural integrity of containments. Details of the basis of our assurance that the containments are safe are provided below:

- Containment structures are designed and constructed to stringent regulatory requirements and quality
- Containment structures are designed to accommodate worst-case accident pressures and temperatures, without exceeding the design leakage rate, and with sufficient margin to account for
- Throughout the service life, the structural and leak-tight integrity of containment structures are monitored and managed through preservice structural integrity test, periodic leakage-rate testing, and periodic inservice inspection programs.
- Degradation issues identified are communicated to industry through generic communications.
- Some licensees of operating reactors have undertaken voluntary evaluations of ultimate capacity of containment structures under severe accidents, which indicates reasonable margins above design basis. This ultimate capacity assessment and aircraft impact assessment are mandatory for new reactors.

Additional details are provided below regarding regulations associated with containment integrity:

- During the original licensing of the plant, the containment undergoes a structural integrity test using 1.15 times the accident design pressure. The basic purpose of a structural proof test is to substantiate that the structure can, in fact, carry the pressure load for which it is designed. By subjecting the structure to some degree of overpressure, the test can show that the containment structure has that margin over design pressure.
- In accordance with the requirements of Part 50, Appendix J, the containment structures are subjected to periodic pressure tests to ensure containment leak-tight integrity.
- In accordance with 10 CFR 50.55a requirements, the containment concrete and metal components are subjected to periodic visual inspections and surveillance in accordance with ASME Code Section XI, subsections IWE and IWL.

Due to the Tohoku-Taiheiyou-Oki Earthquake which occurred on March 11th 2011, TEPCO's facilities including our nuclear power stations have been severely damaged. We deeply apologies for the anxiety and inconvenience caused.

Below is the status of TEPCO's major facilities. \*new items are underlined

#### [Nuclear Power Station]

Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station:

Units 1 to 3: shutdown due to earthquake

(Units 4 to 6: outage due to regular inspection)

- \* The national government has instructed to evacuate for those local residents within 20km radius of the site periphery and to remain indoors for those local residents between 20km and 30km radius of the site periphery.
- \* Unit 1

The explosive sound and white smoke was confirmed near Unit 1 when the big quake occurred at 3:36pm, March 12th. We have started injection of sea water at 8:20 pm and then boric acid into the reactor afterwards.

#### \* Unit 2

At 1:25 pm, March 14th, since the Reactor Core Isolation Cooling System has failed, it was determined that a specific incident stipulated in article 15, clause 1 of Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness occurred (failure of reactor cooling function). At 5:17 pm, while the water level in the reactor reached the top of the fuel rod, we have restarted the water injection with the valve operation. At approximately 6:14 am, March 15th, the abnormal sound was confirmed near the suppression chamber and the pressure inside the chamber decreased afterwards. It was determined that there is a possibility that something happened in the suppression chamber. While sea water injection to the reactor continued, TEPCO employees and workers from other companies not in charge of injection work started tentative evacuation to a safe location.

Sea water injection to the reactor is still under operation.

At 6:50 am, March 14th, while water injection to the reactor was under operation, the pressure in the reactor containment vessel increased to 530 kPa. As a result, at 7:44 am, it was determined that a specific incident stipulated in article 15, clause 1 occurred (abnormal increase of the pressure of reactor containment vessel). Afterwards, the pressure has gradually decreased (as of 9:05 am, 490 kPa).

At approximately 11:01 am, March 14th, an explosion followed by white smoke occurred near Unit 3. 4 TEPCO employees and 3 workers from other companies (all of them are conscious) have sustained injuries and they were already dispatched to the hospital by ambulances.

As the temperature of water in the spent fuel pool rose, spraying water by

helicopters with the support of the Self Defense Force was considered, however the works on March 16th was cancelled.

At 6:15 am, March 17th, the pressure of the Suppression Chamber temporally increased, but currently it is stable in a certain range. Monitoring will be continued.

In order to cool spent fuel pool, water discharge by helicopters has been conducted on March 17th with the cooperation of Self-Defense Force. At approximately past 7:00 pm, March 17th, Self-Defense Forces and the police had started water discharge by water cannon trucks upon our request for the cooperation. At 8:09 pm, March 17th, they had finished water discharge.

#### \* Unit 4

At approximately 6:00 am, March 15th, an explosive sound occurred and the damage in the 5th floor roof of Unit 4 reactor building was confirmed. At 9:38 am, the fire near the north-west part of 4th floor of Unit 4 reactor building was confirmed. At approximately 11:00 am, TEPCO employee confirmed that the fire was off.

At approximately 5:45 am, a TEPCO employee discovered a fire at the northwest corner of the Nuclear Reactor Building. TEPCO immediately reported this incident to the fire department and the local government and proceeded with the extinction of fire. At approximately 6:15 am, TEPCO staff confirmed at the site that there are no signs of fire.

- \* On March 18th, regarding the spent fuel in the common spent fuel pool, we have confirmed that the water level of the pool is secured. A detailed inspection is under preparation.
  - \* common spent fuel pool: a spent fuel pool for common use set in a separate building in a plant site in order to preserve spent fuel which are transferred from the spent fuel pool in each Unit building.
- \* On March 17th, we patrolled buildings for dry casks and found no signs of abnormal situation for the casks by visual observation. A detailed inspection is under preparation.
  - \* dry cask: a measure to store spent fuel in a dry storage casks in storages. Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station started to utilize the measure from August 1995.
- $^{\star}$  We will continuously endeavor to securing safety, and monitoring of the surrounding environment.

#### Fukushima Daini Nuclear Power Station:

#### Units 1 to 4: shutdown due to earthquake

- \* The national government has instructed evacuation for those local residents within 10km radius of the periphery.
- \* In order to achieve cold shutdown, reactor cooling function was restored and cooling of reactors was conducted. As a result, all reactors achieved cold shutdown: Unit 1 at 5:00 pm, March 14th, Unit 2 at 6:00 pm, March 14th, Unit 3 at 0:15 pm, March 12th, Unit 4 at 7:15 am, March 16th.
- \* Since March 12th, we had been preparing measures for reducing the pressure of reactor containment vessels (partial discharge of air containing radioactive materials to outside), but on March 17th, we released such preparation in all Units.

#### \* (Unit 1)

As it is confirmed that the temperature of the Emergency Equipment Cooling Water System \*1 has increased, at 3:20 pm, March 15th, we stopped the Residual Heat Removal System (B) for the inspection. Subsequently, failure

was detected in the power supply facility associated with the pumps of the Emergency Equipment Cooling Water System. At 4:25 pm, March 15th, after replacing the power facility, the pumps and the Residual Heat Removal System (B) have been reactivated.

#### \* (Unit 4)

As it is confirmed that the pressure at the outlet of the pumps of the Emergency Equipment Cooling Water System\*1 has been decreased, at 8:05 pm, March 15th, we stopped the Residual Heat Removal System (B) for the inspection. Subsequently, failure was detected in the power supplyfacility associated with the pumps of the Emergency Equipment Cooling Water System. At 9:25 pm, March 15th, after replacing the relevant facility, the pumps and the Residual Heat Removal System (B) have been reactivated.

\*1:emergency water system in which cooling water (pure water) circulates which exchanged the heat with sea water in order to cool down bearing pumps and/or heat exchangers etc.

#### Kashiwazaki Kariwa Nuclear Power Station:

Units 1, 5, 6, 7: normal operation

(Units 2 to 4: outage due to regular inspection)

#### [Thermal Power Station]



#### **KEY DEVELOPMENTS**

- The earthquake and tsunami have resulted in 6,911 deaths and left 10,692 people missing, as reported by the Government of Japan (GoJ) on March 18. The disasters have damaged or destroyed more than 92,000 buildings and 1,200 roads.
- According to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), the event at the Fukushima Daiichi plant has been raised from level four to level five on the IAEA International Nuclear and Radiological Event Scale—a level equivalent to the 1979 Three Mile Island incident in the U.S. At present, the U.N. World Health Organization has reported no significant risk of radiation exposure for areas outside of Japan.
- The urban search and rescue (USAR) teams from Fairfax County, Virginia, and Los Angeles County, California, concluded their last search and rescue assignment on March 17. Following this, officials from the Osaka Fire Department—the coordinator of international USAR efforts on behalf of the GoJ in Ofunato and Kamaishi cities-indicated that no further assignments are forthcoming from the GoJ. The U.S. USAR teams are coordinating demobilization plans with the local prefecture, Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo.

#### CONTEXT

On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time (EST), or 1446 hours Japan Standard Time (JST), a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred east of Honshu—the largest and main island of Japan—at a depth of approximately 15 miles. The epicenter of the earthquake was located 80 miles east of Sendai, the capital of Miyagi Prefecture, and 231 miles northeast of Tokyo. The m-254

- earthquake generated a large tsunami that resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures.
- On March 11, U.S. Ambassador John V. Roos declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan. USAID/OFDA provided an initial \$100,000 through the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo to assist with local relief efforts. USAID deployed a Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART)—including two USAR teams from Fairfax County, Virginia, and Los Angeles County, California—to support Japanese emergency response efforts. In addition, USAID activated a Response Management Team (RMT) in Washington, D.C.
- InterAction, an alliance of U.S.-based non-governmental organizations (NGOs), maintains a list of organizations accepting donations for the Japanese earthquake response. The American Red Cross (AmRC) accepts donations of \$10 through text messages of "redcross" sent to 90999.

#### **USAR Operations**

- On March 18, the U.S. USAR teams transferred nearly \$145,000 in equipment to the Ofunato fire department to assist with local efforts. The equipment includes 4 zodiac boat kits—containing boats, motor, fuel tanks, and paddles—16 kerosene heaters, 160 cots, and 160 sleeping bags.
- The DART received reports that JSDF—the official lead for GoJ emergency rescue efforts—is transitioning from search and rescue operations to life-sustaining efforts in some or all of Miyagi and Iwate prefectures on March 18. A week following the earthquake and tsunami, little hope for recovery of live victims remains due to the low temperatures in Japan and the lack of survivable spaces in collapsed buildings in the teams' assigned locations.

#### **Logistics and Relief Supplies**

- According to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), logistics are the biggest challenge at this stage of the emergency. GoJ authorities have mobilized a large amount of aid, but fuel shortages resulting from a breakdown of six of nine oil factories in Kanto and Tohoku areas and a lack of transport vehicles are hindering the timely delivery of relief supplies. To address fuel shortages, the GoJ is redirecting 38,000 kiloliters of fuel per day—the average daily demand before the tsunami—from oil refineries in Hokkaido and western Japan.
- On March 16, the GoJ announced a plan for managing and delivering food and relief items to evacuation centers in affected areas, according to the DART. Under the GoJ plan, evacuation centers will send requests for assistance to municipalities, and the prefecture will consolidate the requests and liaise with the national government to request relief items and food from the private sector and other municipalities. The relief supplies will then be consolidated at 50 JSDF sites throughout Japan for distribution by the JSDF and municipalities.
- DoD is assisting relief efforts by providing transportation and other logistical support. The DART is working to vet local prefectures' requests for assistance and convey them to U.S. Forces-Japan (USFJ) for coordination with JSDF for transportation and onward distribution. Sufficient relief commodities are available in-country, and the GoJ has not requested in-kind contributions.
- In close coordination with JSDF, DoD continues to facilitate the transport of in-kind assistance. On March 18, DoD personnel conducted multiple relief missions in affected areas, including the delivery of water, food, and toiletries to approximately 350 people in Karakuwa town in Miyagi Prefecture. As of March 17, DoD personnel had delivered more than 58,000 liters of water and 4,200 lbs of food and flown 197 helicopter and 202 aircraft missions in support of humanitarian assistance efforts in Japan. To date, DoD has provided an estimated \$7.1 million in humanitarian assistance.
- In response to an official request from the GoJ, USAID/OFDA is sending 10,000 personal protective equipment (PPE) kits to Japan for use in recovery clean-up. The airlift containing the PPE departed the U.S. on March 18.

#### **Humanitarian Assessments**

- On March 18, DART staff conducted a ground and aerial assessment of tsunami-affected areas in Miyagi Prefecture. The DART visited two evacuation sites near Minami Sanriku, one of the hardest hit towns, that housed 300 and 1,500 people. According to international media, the tsunami destroyed approximately 95 percent of the buildings in the town and left between 8,000 and 10,000 individuals missing.
- DART staff observed cramped conditions at the centers visited but no life-threatening conditions. Affected individuals continue to receive food, water, blankets, and medical and other supplies through a variety of sources. Authorities in both locations reported receiving a steady stream of assistance from various sources, including the central and prefecture governments, surrounding communities, the JSDF, and the private sector. DART staff noted that the system for submitting requests for assistance and receiving goods appears well-organized and coordinated among the various levels of the GoJ. Local officials at the evacuation centers noted that transportation of the goods from the central or prefectural government to the sites remains a significant challenge due to limited amount of fuel. USFJ is coordinating with the GoJ to ensure the availability of fuel without negatively impacting the domestic fuel economy.

- DART staff observed health clinics in both of the evacuation centers visited, with no significant increases in communicable diseases recorded as a result of the tsunami. Médecins Sans Frontières/Japan staff at the larger evacuation site reported adequate health care, surveillance systems, and medical stocks, with the most commonly reported health issues including common colds, respiratory infections, and chronic conditions. DART staff noted that toilet coverage appeared low at the larger evacuation site; however, Japanese officials noted that additional latrines are currently under construction to meet needs.
- According to evacuation center officials, individuals in affected areas also continue to reside in their houses, where possible.
   While these individuals have been largely self-sufficient to date, they are traveling to the centers to obtain food and other supplies and returning to their houses after receiving supplies.

#### Health

As reported by OCHA, the GoJ is preparing to receive medical help from overseas for the thousands injured by the earthquake
and tsunami. Although doctors without Japanese medical licenses cannot legally practice medicine in Japan, the GoJ Health
Ministry has sent a notice to local governments in Iwate, Miyagi, and Fukushima prefectures indicating that foreign doctors may
administer minor medical procedures. The GoJ has received offers from countries looking to assist Japan in the medical field.

#### **Humanitarian Coordination and Information Management**

- The DART and the RMT continue to link U.S. private and public entities with USG assets to support GoJ emergency response efforts. The RMT assists in these efforts by tracking pledges of financial and in-kind support from major U.S. businesses, as well as facilitating linkages between corporations with technical expertise and other U.S. agencies also responding to the disasters in Japan.
- As of March 17, approximately 13 international or foreign NGOs were working through local partners to provide assistance in Japan's tsunami- and earthquake-affected areas, according to OCHA. Due to current logistical limitations, the GoJ requests that foreign NGOs wait until the situation improves before attempting to conduct activities in Japan.
- According to OCHA, Japanese NGOs are working in northern Japan to bring assistance to affected populations. More Japanese NGOs are expected to arrive in the affected areas in the coming days.

# **Mark I Containment Performance Improvement Program**

Why did we do it?

- WASH-1400 said Mark I containments were too small
- TMI happened
- In SECY-89-017, dated January 23, 1989, the staff presented its findings concerning the Mark I containment Performance Improvement program (CPIP) to the commission.
- Although the PRA studies did not show the BWR Mark I plants to be risk outliers as a class relative to other plant designs, they do suggest that Mark I containments could be challenged by a large scale core melt accident, primarily due to its smaller size.,
- NUREG-1150 confirmed high Mark I failure probability if core melts. The dominant accident sequences were identified as station blackout (SBO), and anticipated transients without scram (ATWS). The list should have included the sequence involving loss of long term decay heat removal (TW), except for the fact that the plant that was selected had the likelihood of containment failure reduced because of assumed successful venting of the containment.
- All Mark I containments had the capability to vent containment. However, the excising vent path was partly made of sheet metal. If venting was performed, as permitted by existing emergency operating procedures (EOPs), sheet metal part of the vent would have failed at the venting pressure levels.
- On September 1, 1989, the Commission responded to the staff recommendations in SECY 89-017 and directed the staff to implement, on generic basis, the installation of hardened vent capabilities at BWRs. With Mark1 Containments.

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#### What did the MK I-CPIP look at?

-Focused on those events that dominate core damage frequency in Mark I ...
-SBO/ATWS/Loss of Decay Heat Removal events (TW sequences)

#### -Goals were:

- Reduce challenges to containment (i.e. lower the frequency of core melts from SBO and TW)
  - Improve containment response to challenging events
  - Mitigate F. P. release from a failed containment

#### Recommendations:

- Provide a hardened vent system that is powered by DC power and vents thru the air space above the suppression pool [provides containment heat removal, to preclude gross containment failure and scrubs fission products ... a controlled release is better than an uncontrolled release]
- o Improve reliability of the ADS (it's easier to get water into a low pressure RCS) ... [improves chances of preventing core melt and facilitates severe accident management]
- Provide an additional low pressure water source to the RCS and drywell sprays that is powered independent of normal or emergency AC (e.g. diesel fire pumps) ...[in conjunction with ADS, this can cool the core (or debris) and scrub fission products]
- o Update emergency procedures and training to address use of these features.

#### - Other considerations

 Additional hydrogen control measures were considered but rejected because the Mark I containments are operated in an inert atmosphere.

#### Commission Action:

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-Commission directed That the recommended improvements should be evaluated on a plant specific basis as part of the IPE program except for the hardened vent recommendation. For hardened vents a GL was issued requesting licensees to provide their plans for either including a hardened vent or advising us that they did not intend to upgrade to a hardened vent. The staff was directed to approve hardened vent installation under 50.59 (i.e., no prior staff review), on plant specific basis to ensure consideration of plant specific features of the specific Mark I containments.

For facilities not electing to voluntarily incorporate design changes, the Commission directed the staff to perform plant specific back fit analyses..

- 6. We've added links to publicly available documents to the NRR SharePoint site: http://portal.nrc.gov/edo/nrr/default.aspx for access by all staff.
- 7. Harold has been working with DPR re: ListServ distribution of the IN. We haven't distributed gen comms in this way in the past so there are some bugs to work out.
- 8. I trying to develop a protocol/process for interacting with the Liaison Team. The Liaison Team's role is to coordinate the review of Qs and As by the Regional State Liaison Officers (RSLOs) and our partners in FEMA and DOE. When our Qs and As are complete, we need to send to the Liaison Team so they can coordinate that review.
- 9. Hopefully, Annie Kammerer will have her version of her seismic Q&A document reduced to a publicly releasable form tonite.
- 10. I talked to Eric about management reviews for Qs & As my team develops. I have an IOU to recommend a process.
- 11. NRO has offered Eric Oesterle to help. We'll link up with him on Monday.

# WORK SCHEDULE AND PREMIUM PAY GUIDANCE FOR RESPONSE TO EVENTS IN JAPAN

Please first review this document and contact Larry Davidson of the Office of Human Resources (301-492-2286 or lawrence.davidson@nrc.gov) for any needed assistance.

#### **Work Schedules**

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One or more types of work schedules may be appropriate during a pay period in which you serve in and support the NRC Operations Center or work in Japan, in response to the current, serious nuclear power plant issues in that country. You are authorized to select the <u>type</u> of work schedule you will work during the pay period depending on:

- Your specific workdays and work clocks hours in the Operations Center or in Japan, as well as any flexibility you have to choose those workdays and clock hours;
- Your entitlement to premium pay for work in the Operations Center or Japan;
- Your performance, if any, of regular duties outside of the Operations Center/Japan during the pay period; and,
- Your loss of earned credit hours if you switch from NEWFlex to another type of work schedule.

#### Possible work schedules include:

- Compressed work schedule Appropriate if, during the entire pay period, your workdays and work clock hours are <u>fixed</u> (i.e., you do <u>not</u> have any flexibility to choose either) and there are fewer than ten nonovertime workdays in the pay period (at least one nonovertime workday contains more than eight nonovertime hours). Note that restrictions on nonovertime work clock hours and weekend workdays have been lifted for the pay period. An Expanded-Compressed Work Schedule may be appropriate (see the Yellow Announcement at <a href="http://www.internal.nrc.gov/announcements/yellow/2003/2003-032.html">http://www.internal.nrc.gov/announcements/yellow/2003/2003-032.html</a> and Article 6.10.3 of the <a href="https://compressed-collective-bargaining-agreement">Collective-bargaining-agreement</a>).
- <u>NEWFlex</u> Appropriate if, during at least a portion of the pay period, you have some
  discretion to select your workdays and/or work clock hours (for example, if/when
  performing regular duties outside of the Operations Center or Japan). Note that
  restrictions on nonovertime work clock hours and weekend workdays have been lifted for
  the pay period.
- <u>First-40</u> Appropriate if it is impracticable to prescribe a regular schedule of definite hours of duty for each workday of the workweek (likely not appropriate).

Note that you must advise your T&L coordinator to change your HRMS workgroup if you change the type of schedule you work, e.g., if you normally work CWS and change to NEWFlex for the pay period in which you serve in and support the NRC Operations Center or work in Japan. Also note that if you switch from NEWFlex to another type of work schedule, you will lose and will be paid for any accumulated credit hours.

Also note that if you work fewer than 80 hours serving in and supporting the NRC Operations Center or working in Japan, your "home" supervisor will allow you discretion, to the extent possible, to decide how/when to cover any missing time.

### **Premium Pay**

<u>Cap on Combined Salary Plus Premium Pay</u> –The biweekly cap on premium pay has been lifted and will be applied on an annual basis during any pay period in which you serve in and support the NRC Operations Center or work in Japan (the annual cap will benefit you if you are paid a salary below the GG-15 step 10 salary rate). Your organization has been advised to contact CFO with employee names and dates of work.

Overtime pay or regular comp time – Overtime (limited to the higher of: your regular rate; or, 150% of GG-10 step 10) is paid for your work in excess of your full-time work schedule during the pay period. You may choose to be compensated via regular compensatory time off instead (limited to a 40-hour pay period carryover) if your overtime work was not scheduled in advance of the workweek, or regardless of when it was scheduled if you are on NEWFlex.

TRCs – Use "OT" for overtime pay and "COMPE" for regular comp time.

Night premium (10%) –This premium is paid for your *nonovertime* work between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following morning, and for your *overtime* work during these clock hours if the work was scheduled in advance of the week in which you performed it. Also, this premium is paid for your periods of paid leave, if any, during night clock hours if, during the pay period, you have fewer than 8 hours of total paid leave inclusive of both night and day work.

TRC – NDIFF (hours must also be recorded under another TRC such as REG or OT).

<u>Sunday premium (25%)</u> – This premium is paid for your *nonovertime* work performed on a shift(s), <u>any part(s) of which falls on a Sunday</u> (e.g., a shift from Saturday at 6:00 p.m. to Sunday at 6:00 a.m.). Sunday premium is not payable for periods of nonwork, including leave, holidays not worked, and excused absence.

TRC – SUNP (hours must also be recorded under another TRC such as REG).

<u>Standby status</u> - You are eligible for special overtime pay if you are restricted by official order to a designated post of duty and assigned to be in a state of readiness to perform work, versus actually performing work, with limitations on your activities so substantial that you cannot use

your time effectively for your own purposes. We do not anticipate that any employee will be in a standby status.

## <u>Miscellaneous</u>

### Employee Assistance Program (EAP)

Free, confidential counseling is available to you and your family members to address emotional issues, work problems, substance abuse, stress, crisis, marital/family concerns, financial matters, legal issues, eldercare resources, and childcare referrals. ## **Travel**

If you travel to/from Japan:

- Keep a log of specific travel times and work clock hours to help NRC compute your entitlement to compensation.
- Consider enrolling in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program or STEP) to make it easier
  for the Embassy/Consulates to contact you in case of an emergency. You may enroll at
  https://travelregistration.state.gov, or if you have no internet access, directly at the U.S.
  Embassy or U.S. Consulates.
- If you are paid a salary below the GG-15 step 10 salary rate, you are entitled to overtime pay (limited to higher of: your regular rate; or, 150% of GG-10 step 10) for travel to/from Japan, and if the travel is during night hours (6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.) and scheduled in advance of the workweek, you are also entitled to night premium pay. You may substitute regular compensatory time off (limited to a 40-hour pay period carryover) for overtime pay if your travel was not scheduled in advance of the workweek, or regardless of when it was scheduled if you are on NEWFlex.

TRCs – Use "OT" for overtime pay, "COMPE" for regular comp time, and "NDIFF" for night premium pay.

The Government of Japan (GoJ) National Police Agency reported 7,348 deaths, 10,947 persons missing, and 2,603 people injured due to the earthquake and tsunami as of 0500 hours EDT on March 19. In addition, the natural disasters damaged or destroyed more than 117,000 buildings and 1,300 roads.

Conditions at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant remain relatively stable as of 0500 hours EDT March 19, according to U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) personnel on the RMT. DART and RMT staff facilitated a NRC–Bechtel collaboration to design and procure 12 pumps intended to inject water into spent fuel pools, which are being transported to Japan by the Government of Australia and U.S. Forces-Japan. The NRC plans to host an information-sharing, industry to industry/government agency meeting at 1400 hours EDT today.

#### **USG ASSISTANCE**

The U.S. Agency for International Development is working with agencies across the U.S. Government—including the Departments of State, Defense, and Energy and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission—to assure that we are able to provide necessary assistance to the Government of Japan in the aftermath of the devastating earthquake and tsunami.

The USAID Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) is in Japan and working to manage the overall U.S. Government response effort in Japan in coordination with the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo.

Nuclear specialists on the DART—including 11 NRC officers, 1 DoE officer, and 1 U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) officer—are monitoring technical aspects of the nuclear issues at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant, engaging with GoJ officials on the status of the health impacts of radiation, and providing guidance to the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo on efforts to cool reactors.

DART staff continue to engage at three levels to determine any possible humanitarian needs in Japan—nationally through Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) and other GoJ contacts, locally at the prefecture level and in coordination with U.S. Forces-Japan, and through Japanese civil society organizations, including Japan Platform (JP) and the Japan Non-governmental organization (NGO) Center for International Cooperation (JANIC).

On a March 18 field assessment to Miyagi Prefecture, DART staff observed that assistance is flowing in an organized manner from the national level to the evacuation center level. However, concerns that fuel shortages may limit the transport of existing relief supplies remain. To address fuel shortages, the GoJ is working to redirect 38,000 kiloliters of fuel per day—the average daily

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demand before the tsunami—from oil refineries in Hokkaido and western Japan. In addition, USFJ continues to coordinate with the GoJ to ensure the availability of fuel without negatively impacting the domestic fuel economy.

The DART is working to vet requests for assistance from local prefectures and convey them to USFJ for coordination with JSDF for transportation and onward distribution. The DART notes that sufficient relief commodities are available in-country and the GoJ has not requested in-kind contributions.

On March 13, USAID's Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) teams from Fairfax County and Los Angeles County, comprising 144 personnel and 12 live search canines, arrived in Misawa, Japan and were immediately dispatched to Ofunato in Iwate prefecture. In coordination with the Government of Japan(GoJ), the National Japanese USAR teams and our international partners, the U.S. USAR teams completed all searches the GoJ asked for in the central portion of the city of Ofunato and Kamaishi City. Japanese Self Defense Forces marked the end of rescue efforts and a transition to humanitarian missions in Iwate and Miyagi with a moment of silence. The U.S. USAR teams are now returning to the United States, and they should arrive on Saturday afternoon in LA and just after midnight in Fairfax.

Prior to their departure, the U.S. USAR teams transferred nearly \$145,000 in equipment to the Ofunato fire department to assist with local recovery efforts. The equipment includes 4 zodiac boat kits—containing boats, motor, fuel tanks, and paddles—16 kerosene heaters, 160 cots, and 160 sleeping bags.

# Dear ANS Members.

We are all saddened by the catastrophic earthquake and tsunami in Japan and the resulting damage to the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Station. As we move forward, it is critically important that we work together to ensure that our federal policy makers have accurate information about nuclear technology and radiation.

Your Senators and Members of Congress are returning to their States and Districts next week, and I encourage you to schedule a meeting with them while they are back home. They need to know they have constituents with nuclear related technical expertise who can help them make sense of this very complex and dynamic situation in Japan.

I suggest you take these steps:

- 1. Find the phone numbers of your Senators' state offices by accessing their website here <a href="http://www.senate.gov/general/contact\_information/senators\_cfm.cfm">http://www.senate.gov/general/contact\_information/senators\_cfm.cfm</a>. You can find your Member of Congress' district office by clicking here <a href="http://www.house.gov/zip/ZIP2Rep.html">http://www.house.gov/zip/ZIP2Rep.html</a>.
- 2. Call their scheduler and ask for an appointment. Let them know you are a constituent and a member of the American Nuclear Society with knowledge relevant to technical aspects of the situation in Japan. If you are offered a meeting with staff, accept.
- 3. Once you have an appointment, arm yourself with information. Unfortunately, we cannot provide you with up-to-date talking points since the situation itself is so fluid. Instead, your role is to help the member understand some of the many technical issues, learn about their concerns and share your expertise. Below are some reliable sources of information, which are being updated regularly:

- 4. On the day of the meeting,

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- \* Be prompt and patient. It is not uncommon for a member of Congress to be late or to have a meeting interrupted due to a crowded schedule.
- \* Be grateful. Make sure you open the conversation by thanking the members/staff for his/her time, and send a handwritten thank you note afterwards.
- \* Be honest. The situation in Japan is a difficult one. Don't feel the need to provide "spin." Stick to the facts as you know them and don't be afraid to say that you do not know the answer to a question. The goal is to be a technical resource for them to contact in the future and let them know your support for NS&T in general.
- \* Be responsive. Make sure you follow up promptly if the member/staff has asked you to provide any additional information or analysis. Contact us at japanfacts@ans.org if you need help.


Again, your goal is to be a technical resource to your Senators/Representative and their staffs, providing perspective and correcting misperceptions without sugarcoating the situation.

- The earthquake and tsunami have resulted in more than 7,500 deaths and left nearly 11,700 people missing, as reported by the Government of Japan (GoJ) on March 19. The natural disasters also damaged or destroyed more than 117,000 buildings and 1,300 roads.
- On March 19, the GoJ Ministry of Economy, Trade, and Industry (METI) noted expectations that fuel shortages that have been hampering relief supply delivery during the past week should begin to improve in coming days as two large refineries resume operations and 300 fuel trucks commence deliveries to affected areas. According to local media, METI staff have identified priority gas stations in affected areas to receive fuel supplies as they become available and have shared the list with trucking associations, police, local governments, and fuel distributors.
- The GoJ has announced the creation of a sub-task force under the Prime Minister to strengthen and further systematize GoJ response in tsunami-affected areas. The new task force is headed by the GoJ Minister of State for Disaster Management and will work to meet needs in isolated areas, ensure replenishment of relief supplies, and restore vital lifelines, such as electricity and water. The new sub-task force will also work to further enhance measures to provide material support to affected areas.
- Following nearly a week of urban search and rescue (USAR) operations, the GoJ expressed appreciation for the efforts of the U.S. USAR teams from Fairfax County, Virginia, and Los Angeles County, California. The U.S. teams departed Japan on March 19 after completing all GoJ-assigned missions.

CONTEXT

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- On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time, or 1446 hours Japan Standard Time, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off the east coast of Honshu Island, Japan—approximately 231 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 15 miles, generating a tsunami that struck the eastern coast of Japan and resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Furthermore, the natural disasters led to a serious nuclear incident at the Fukushima Daiichi power plant located approximately 150 miles north of Tokyo.
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   USAID activated a Response Management Team (RMT) in Washington, D.C., and deployed a Disaster Assistance Response
   Team (DART)—including USAR specialists and nuclear experts—to support Japanese emergency response efforts.

#### **Humanitarian Coordination and Response**

- DART staff note that the GoJ has been responding robustly to humanitarian needs arising from the earthquake and tsunami, and the Prime Minister's newly announced sub-task force represents a further augmentation in capacity. Under the new GoJ system, the national government plans to collect relief items and food from municipalities and the private sector and consolidate it at approximately 50 Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) sites nationwide. The JSDF or local government will distribute the supplies to evacuation centers. DART staff note that the system—if implemented as described—may alleviate challenges that have hampered the transportation of supplies to date, as the JSDF reported having adequate fuel supplies to conduct operations.
- According to the Japan Platform—a consortium of Japanese civil society, private sector, and government organizations—local officials have reported that poor road access has created small pockets of isolated populations in tsunami-affected areas. The JSDF has assembled teams to facilitate voluntary transport to evacuation centers and expects to reach all isolated populations within the next two days. Approximately 94 percent of main roads reaching affected coastal areas had been repaired as of March 19, with additional repairs ongoing in affected areas, according to the GoJ. In addition, six previously damaged sea ports are now operational and the Sendai airport is open for a limited number of emergency and humanitarian flights.
- On March 19, prefectures across Japan announced plans to provide temporary housing for evacuees from tsunami- and nuclear-affected areas. According to international media, Shimane Prefecture has 675 public houses available for evacuee families and plans to provide evacuees staying in the prefecture with 300,000 yen—approximately \$3,722—per household for living expenses, and the Tokyo Metropolitan Government also plans to accommodate 1,600 evacuees in public buildings. In addition, the governor of Hyogo Prefecture announced that seven prefectures in the Kansai area of western Japan will accept and provide temporary shelter for earthquake evacuees.

#### **Logistics and Relief Supplies**

- The U.N. World Food Program (WFP) has reported plans to deploy logisticians to the GoJ central coordination response unit and to establish a logistics coordination cell at Narita Airport in Tokyo to help prevent congestion due to relief item donations. WFP also plans to provide emergency storage facilities to support GoJ efforts.
- The GoJ has commenced the transport of 600,000 liters of gasoline to meet humanitarian needs, following the delivery of 60,000 liters on March 18, according to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs. The GoJ has also disbursed approximately \$66 million from a reserve fund to cover fuel costs for JSDF relief efforts.
- On March 19, U.S. Joint Forces—Japan (USFJ) delivered nearly 5,000 daily servings of food and water, as well as 18,600 pounds of emergency relief supplies to affected communities. USFJ personnel have conducted more than 400 helicopter and aircraft missions and transported a total of approximately 60,000 daily servings of food and water and 80,000 pounds of emergency relief supplies since March 11. USFJ continues to assist in delivering additional relief supplies to affected locations
- Two DART military liaison officers remain at the Yokota Air Force Base outside of Tokyo, Japan, to work with USFJ in defining humanitarian requirements and validating humanitarian operations. DART staff continue to work with USFJ to clarify the scope and scale of the overall military mission in ongoing USG humanitarian assistance operations.

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- On March 18, the non-governmental organization International Medical Corps (IMC) conducted an assessment of Matsushima city in Miyagi Prefecture. IMC staff noted limited damage to the city, where the local hospital is near capacity but functioning well, with a referral and transfer system in place and local volunteer medical staff filling gaps in personnel. To further augment capacity, local officials noted that a 30-person team of volunteer physicians from Hyogo plan to arrive in the area in the coming days. During the visit, IMC staff did not identify any acute population or health care needs.
- In East Matsushima city, IMC reported that approximately 14,000 evacuees are staying in 80 centers managed by the local Public Health and Social Welfare Service director. Fuel shortages and other public service disruptions present a challenge to relief delivery, as noted in DART assessments of other affected areas; however, the JSDF, other GoJ agencies, and the Japanese Red Cross Society continue to distribute water and other supplies at various locations in the city.

#### Situation at Nuclear Power Plants

- DART nuclear specialists noted no significant changes at the Fukushima Daiichi power plant on March 19, with JSDF continuing attempts to cool spent fuel ponds. According to the International Atomic Energy Agency, the Tokyo Electric Power Company is also ventilating the rooftops of units 5 and 6 of the Daiichi plant to release hydrogen and prevent further explosions.
- To date, staff from the DART and the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo report no increase in radiation levels in Tokyo.


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

#### **KEY DEVELOPMENTS**

- The earthquake and tsunami have resulted in nearly 8,500 deaths and left nearly 13,000 people missing, as reported by the Government of Japan (GoJ) on March 20. The natural disasters also damaged or destroyed more than 126,000 buildings and 1,400 roads.
- On March 20, USAID/OFDA Director Mark Bartolini arrived in Tokyo for a three-day visit to meet with staff from the U.S. Embassy, U.S. Department of Defense (DoD), U.N. agencies, and non-governmental organizations, as well as travel to tsunami-affected areas with the Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART). In addition, a third DART military liaison officer arrived in Tokyo to work with DoD in defining humanitarian requirements and validating humanitarian operations. The DART currently comprises 20 members, including representatives from USAID, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and the U.S. Department of Energy (DoE).
- In response to a GoJ request, USAID/OFDA has dispatched 10,000 sets of personal protective equipment (PPE)—including suits, masks, gloves, decontamination bags, and other supplies—to Yokota, Japan, from the USAID/OFDA chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and radiological warehouse at Dobbins Air Reserve Base in Georgia. The PPE sets are scheduled to arrive on March 21 local time for consignment to the GoJ.
- Japan Self-Defense Force (JSDF) and other GoJ personnel had transported nearly all of 23,000 previously isolated individuals to evacuation centers as of March 19, according to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). GoJ officials reported that only 20 people remained isolated due to damaged roads and communications in Miyagi and Fukushima prefectures.

#### FY 2011 HUMANITARIAN FUNDING PROVIDED TO JAPAN TO DATE

#### CONTEXT

- On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time, or 1446 hours Japan Standard Time, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off the east coast of Honshu Island, Japan—approximately 231 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 15 miles, generating a tsunami that struck the eastern coast of Japan and resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Furthermore, the natural disasters led to a serious nuclear incident at the Fukushima Daiichi power plant located approximately 150 miles north of Tokyo.
- On March 11, U.S. Ambassador John V. Roos declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan. USAID/OFDA provided an initial \$100,000 through the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo to assist with local relief efforts. In addition, USAID activated a Response Management Team (RMT) in Washington, D.C., and deployed a DART—including urban search and rescue (USAR) specialists and nuclear experts—to support Japanese emergency response efforts.

#### **Humanitarian Situation and Response**

- The GoJ is progressively opening damaged roads, and the JSDF plans to reach all remaining isolated populations in the coming days. Approximately 120,000 national emergency service personnel are currently working in the most affected areas of Japan, repairing infrastructure and distributing a significant amount of food, water, blankets, and other supplies to individuals in evacuation centers.
- The number of individuals residing in evacuation centers is decreasing as road repairs enable displaced individuals to travel to relatives' and friends' houses in unaffected areas or return to their houses as electricity is restored, according to OCHA. On March 20, OCHA reported that the number of people living in evacuation centers had decreased by more than 15,700 people—or 5 percent—since March 18.
- As of March 20, more than 21,000 residents of affected areas had relocated to other parts of Japan, according to OCHA. The GoJ Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport, and Tourism has requested Japan's housing industry build 30,000 transitional shelters—including two rooms, a kitchen, toilet, and washroom—in the next two months and has deployed specialist teams to the affected areas to select suitable locations for shelter placement. Construction has begun in Iwate Prefecture, where workers had completed approximately 200 shelters as of March 20, according to OCHA. In addition, all of Japan's prefectures are making plans to provide more sustainable housing for the displaced population in evacuation centers.

#### **Logistics and Relief Supplies**

- DART staff note that limited supply of fuel for relief supply transport continues to represent the most significant challenge to the earthquake and tsunami response effort to date. To ease shortages in affected areas, the GoJ has delivered approximately 600,000 liters of fuel per day for the past two days. As of March 20, the GoJ had delivered a total of 4.3 million liters of fuel to affected prefectures and is using 280 tanker vehicles for gasoline transport, OCHA reported.
- As of March 19, approximately 17,000 U.S. Military personnel, 100 aircraft, and 14 ships were assisting or prepared to support relief operations in Japan, including by providing transportation of relief commodities.

#### Situation at Nuclear Power Plants

- The GoJ has detected radiation levels in milk from a farm in Fukushima above the limit set by a national food safety law.

  Officials also reported radiation levels over food safety limits in seven samples of spinach from Ibaraki Prefecture. According to the GoJ Chief Cabinet Secretary, the radiation levels are not expected to pose any immediate health hazards, and the GoJ is monitoring other food products.
- DoE, DART, and U.S. Embassy staff also actively continue to monitor and triangulate information on radiation levels in Tokyo.
   Despite recent media reports to the contrary, all three U.S. agencies continue to report no increases in radiation levels in Tokyo at this time.

Tim -

I just spoke with Bill Ruland, and he told me to send you this.

I am quite confident that the valves and spool pieces to connect to the fire main are well known to PWRs for AFW and to BWRs for RCIC (perhaps CST refill) in the steam phase, and to low pressure systems, also, for later.

Thus, any US plant would be able to use a pumper or an external skid source.

I am quite confident that the US folk could disconnect a battery and reconnect to one on a skid. I am also quite confident that folk could change-out cells, replacing the battery in-situ one cell at a time with ones from a pallet.

Thus, a skid-mounted AC source that powered a battery charger (perhaps via inverter on the same or another skid) would be a good thing. If one used it to recharge cells, the skid might never have to get to the battery location, either physically or by cable. Instead, the cells could be what moved. Of course, if the charger could be cabled to the DC bus, so much the better.

The reason I brought all the above up is that I am <u>not</u> confident that the US folk have thought out how to wire in a purely external skid AC power source to the key AC loads directly. Transformers? Switchgear? Voltage matching? Fusing? Breakers? All the assumptions I seem to recall from yesteryear included that the power entry point was much higher in the power flow path than the load, such that installed plant hardware would be available to provide those functions. Following a gross immersion event (or something of the same in common-cause effect), that hardware might well not be available.

Thus, providing some short term AC source would require also providing functional upstream components, unless a skid-mounted AC source included those features (e.g., temp switchgear, breakers, etc.)

Today at approximately 2:46PM, turbines and reactors of Tokyo Electric Power Company's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station Unit 1 (Boiling Water Reactor, rated output 460 Megawatts) and Units 2 and 3 (Boiling Water Reactor, Rated Output 784 Megawatts) that had been operating at rated power automatically shutdown due to the Miyagiken-oki Earthquake.

For the above 3 units, off-site power was lost due to malfunction of one out of two off-site power systems, leading to automatic startup of emergency diesel generators.

Subsequently, at 3:41PM, emergency diesel generators shutdown due to malfunction resulting in the complete loss of alternating current for all three units.

Hence, at 3:42PM, it was decided that a specific incident stipulated in Article 10, Clause 1 of the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness has occurred and a "First Level Emergency" was declared

Subsequently, since the status of reactor water coolant injection could not be confirmed for the emergency core cooling systems of Units 1 and 2, at 4:36PM, it was decided that a specific incident stipulated in Article 15, Clause 1 of the Act has occurred.

Article 15, Clause 1 of the Act was cleared when the reactor water level monitoring function was restored for Unit 1. However, at 5:07PM, specific incident stipulated in Article 15, Clause 1 of the Act was applied again for Unit 1.

### **ADDRESSEES**

All holders of or applicants for operating licenses for nuclear power reactors under the provision of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 50, "Domestic Licensing of Production and Utilization Facilities," except those who have permanently ceased operations and have certified that fuel has been permanently removed from the reactor vessel.

All holders of or applicants for a standard design certification, standard design approval, manufacturing license, limited work authorization, early site permits or combined license issued under 10 CFR Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants."

### **PURPOSE**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is issuing this information notice (IN) to inform addressees of effects of the Tohoku-Taiheiyou-Oki Earthquake on nuclear power plants in Japan. The NRC expects that recipients will review the information for applicability to their facilities and consider actions, as appropriate, to avoid similar problems. Suggestions contained in this IN are not NRC requirements; therefore, no specific action or written response is required.

### **DESCRIPTION OF CIRCUMSTANCES**

The following summary of events is provided based on the best information available at this time. The situation in Japan regarding recovery efforts for the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station continues to evolve on an hourly basis.

On March 11, 2011, the Tohoku-Taiheiyou-Oki Earthquake occurred near the east coast of Honshu, Japan. This magnitude 9.0 earthquake and the subsequent tsunami caused significant damage to at least four of the six units of the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power station as the result of a sustained loss of both the offsite and on-site power systems. Efforts to restore power to emergency equipment have been hampered or impeded by damage to the surrounding areas due to the tsunami and earthquake.

### ML110760432

Units 1 through 3, which had been operating at the time of the earthquake, scrammed automatically, inserting their neutron absorbing control rods to ensure immediate shutdown of the fission process. Following the loss of electric power to normal and emergency core cooling systems and the subsequent failure of back-up decay heat removal systems, water injection into the cores of all three reactors was compromised, and reactor water levels could not be maintained. Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO), the operator of the plant, resorted to injecting sea water and boric acid into the reactor vessels of these three units, in an effort to cool the fuel and ensure the reactors remained shutdown. However, the fuel in the reactor cores became partially uncovered. Hydrogen gas built up in Units 1 and 3 as a result of exposed, overheated fuel reacting with water. Following gas venting from the primary containment to relieve pressure, hydrogen explosions occurred in both units and damaged the secondary containments. It appears that primary containments for Units 1 and 3 remain functional, but the primary containment for Unit 2 may be damaged. TEPCO cut a hole in the side of the Unit 2 secondary containment to prevent hydrogen buildup following a sustained period when there was no water injection into the core.

In addition, Units 3 and 4 have low spent fuel pool (SFP) water levels. Efforts continue to supply seawater to the SFPs for Units 1 through 4 using various methods. At this time, the integrity of the SFPs for Units 3 and 4 is unknown.

Fukushima Daiichi Units 4 through 6 were shutdown for refueling outages at the time of the earthquake. The fuel assemblies for Unit 4 had been offloaded from the reactor core to the SFP. The SFPs for Units 5 and 6 appear to be intact, but the temperature of the pool water appears to be increasing. Emergency power is available to provide cooling water flow through the SFPs for Units 5 and 6.

The Japanese Government ordered an evacuation out to 20 km for the area surrounding Fukushima Daiichi. Residents out to 30 km were ordered to shelter in place.

The damage to Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power station appears to have been caused by initiating events outside of the design basis for the facilities.

### **BACKGROUND**

10 CFR Part 50, Appendix A, "General Design Criteria for Nuclear Power Plants," General Design Criterion (GDC) 2, "Design Bases for Protection against Natural Phenomena," or similar appropriate requirements in the licensing basis for a reactor facility, requires that structures, systems, and components (SSCs) important to safety be designed to withstand the effects of natural phenomena such as earthquakes, tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, tsunami, and seiches without loss of capability to perform their safety functions. The design bases for these SSCs reflect: (1) appropriate consideration of the most severe of the natural phenomena that have been historically reported for the site and surrounding area, with sufficient margin for the limited accuracy, quantity, and period of time in which the historical data have been accumulated, (2) appropriate combinations of the effects of normal and accident conditions with the effects of the natural phenomena, and (3) the importance of the safety functions to be performed.

As a result of the terrorist events of September 11, 2001, the NRC issued EA-02-026, "Order for Interim Safeguards and Security Compensatory Measures" (the ICM Order) dated February 25, 2002. The ICM Order, which is designated as Safeguards Information (SGI), modified thenoperating licenses for commercial power reactor facilities to require compliance with specified interim safeguards and security compensatory measures. Section B.5.b of the ICM Order requires licensees to adopt mitigation strategies using readily available resources to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and SFP cooling capabilities to cope with the loss of large areas of the facility due to large fires and explosions from any cause, including beyond-design-basis aircraft impacts.

By letter, dated February 25, 2005, the NRC staff provided guidance for implementing Section B.5.b of the ICM Order. This guidance, designated as SGI, included best practices for mitigating losses of large areas of the plant and measures to mitigate fuel damage and minimize releases. Following issuance of the B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance, the NRC staff conducted inspections at operating reactor sites using Temporary Instruction (TI) 2515/164 (SGI) and subsequently TI 2515/168 (SGI) to ensure compliance with Section B.5.b of the ICM Order.

In December 2006, the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) issued NEI 06-12, Revision 2, "B.5.b Phase 2 & 3 Submittal Guideline." NEI 06-12 is designated for Official Use Only – Security Related Information (OUO-SRI). The NRC endorsed NEI 06-12, Revision 2, by letter dated December 22, 2006, also designated OUO-SRI, as an acceptable means for developing and implementing the mitigation strategies requirement in Section B.5.b of the ICM Order. NEI 06-12, Revision 2, provides guidance for implementing a set of strategies intended to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and SFP cooling capabilities under the circumstances associated with the loss of a large area of the plant due to explosions or fire. NEI 06-12 provides guidance in the following areas:

- Adding make-up water to the SFP,
- · Spraying water on the spent fuel,
- Enhanced initial command and control activities for challenges to core cooling and containment, and
- Enhanced response strategies for challenges to core cooling and containment.

The specific strategies covered in NEI 06-12, Revision 2, were developed based on the results of assessments conducted at currently licensed power reactor facilities for the purpose of enhancing plant specific mitigation capability for damage conditions caused by a large explosion or fire. These assessments identified a wide spectrum of potential plant specific strategies. NEI 06-12, Revision 2, specifies one set of strategies applicable to all pressurized-water reactors and another set applicable to all boiling-water reactors. Both sets are derived from the results of the plant specific assessments.

The B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance and NEI 06-12, Revision 2, were used by each licensee in preparing information submitted to the NRC that describes a plant specific approach to implementing mitigating strategies and supports each plant specific license condition. The NRC staff has completed its review of the information submitted by each licensee, as well as information obtained during prior NRC inspections, and has issued an OUO-SRI safety

evaluation (SE) that documents the bases for its approval of the license condition for each facility. The SE issued for each licensee includes regulatory guidance in Section 3.0 of Appendix A, "Phase 1 Assessment," that recites the generic B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance of Reference 3, as clarified in TI 2515/168, in a form that is designated OUO-SRI rather than SGI.

By publishing new requirements in the Federal Register dated March 27, 2009 (74 FR 13926), the NRC amended 10 CFR Part 50, 10 CFR Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications, and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants," and 10 CFR Part 73, "Physical Protection of Plants and Materials." This rulemaking added paragraph (i) to 10 CFR 50.34, "Contents of Applications; Technical Information," and paragraph (d) to 10 CFR 52.80 " Contents of Applications; Additional Technical Information," to require submittal of a "description and plans for implementation of the quidance and strategies intended to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and spent fuel pool cooling capabilities under the circumstances associated with the loss of large areas of the plant due to explosions or fire as required by § 50.54(hh)(2) of this chapter." This rulemaking also added 10 CFR 50.54(hh)(2) to impose the same mitigating strategies requirements on all reactor applicants and licensees as those imposed by the ICM Order and associated license conditions. The Statement of Considerations for this rulemaking specifically noted that the requirements in 10 CFR 50.54(hh) are intended to address certain events that are the cause of large fires and explosions that affect a substantial portion of the nuclear power plant and are not limited or directly linked to an aircraft impact. In addition, the rule contemplates that the initiating event for such large fires and explosions could be any number of beyond-design basis events. Such events include natural phenomena such as those described in GDC 2 (i.e., earthquakes, tornadoes, floods, tsunami, and seiches), without regard to the GDC 2 provisions governing the severity of natural phenomena.

NRC regulations at 10 CFR 50.63, "Loss of All Alternating Current Power," require that light-water-cooled nuclear power plants be capable of withstanding for a specified duration and recovering from a station blackout.

### DISCUSSION

The nuclear power industry has taken the actions listed below at each licensed reactor site. Additional information is available in the NEI Fact Sheet, "Industry Taking Action to Ensure Continued Safety at U.S. Nuclear Energy Plants," dated March 16, 2011, available at <a href="https://www.nei.org">www.nei.org</a>.

- verification of the capability to mitigate conditions that result from severe adverse events, including the loss of significant operational and safety systems due to natural events, fires, aircraft impact and explosions
- 2. verification of the capability to mitigate a total loss of electric power to a nuclear power plant
- 3. verification of the capability to mitigate flooding and the impact of floods on systems inside and outside the plant
- 4. identification of the potential for loss of equipment functions during seismic events appropriate for the site and the development of mitigating strategies to address potential vulnerabilities

NRC assessment of the implications of beyond design-basis natural phenomena is continuing as more information becomes available. The NRC staff is currently developing a TI to guide staff in performing independent assessments of nuclear power plant readiness to address beyond design-basis natural phenomena under the Reactor Oversight Process. The NRC is considering additional generic communications and additional action including requesting operating plants to provide specific information relating to their facilities to enable the NRC staff to complete a regulatory assessment of beyond design basis phenomena.

The Chairman has requested for the NRC to conduct a Near-term (90 day effort) and a longer-term review (as discussed by Bill B at the Commission meeting today) of regulatory issues affecting U.S. operating reactors based on the events in Japan. The Chairman is interested in seeking supplemental funding to support our efforts for the above effort, in addition to NRC's costs associated with emergency response and technical experts sent to Japan. OCFO is preparing cost data associated with emergency response and technical support to Japan.

On Friday, the OCFO requested some initial estimates to support the reviews (see attached). At this time, we are requesting the offices to review these initial estimates and include some information concerning the work that is envisioned to support these reviews. Listed below are some initial thoughts about the scope of the near-term and long-term reviews. Also, consider what on-going efforts related to the development of our regulatory program could benefit with supplemental funding. For example, it was mentioned in the Commission meeting that NRC is currently working on GSI-199. Should funding be accelerated for this effort and others of this nature.

### Near Term Review (90 day effort):

- Evaluate currently available technical and operational information from the Japan event to identify near-term (or immediate) operational or regulatory issues affection U.S. operating reactors of all designs in areas such as protection against earthquakes, tsunami, flooding, hurricanes, station blackout and a degraded ability to restore power; severe accident mitigation and emergency preparedness
- Develop recommendations for generic communications, orders, changes to inspection procedures and licensing review guidance, etc.
- Possibly prepare a 30 day quick look report

### Longer-Term Review (Following obtaining sufficient technical information from the Japan event)

 Evaluate all technical and policy issues related to the event to identify additional research, generic issues, changes to the reactor oversight process, rulemakings and adjustments to the regulatory framework that should be conducted by the NRC.

- Evaluate interagency issues such as emergency preparedness.
- Applicability of the lessons learned to non-operating reactor and non-reactor facilities.

It is recognized that the full scope of the reviews has yet to be determined or the size of the group that will be conducting the analysis. Therefore, we are looking only for rough cost estimates. You are requested to send the level of funding (dollars and FTE) that is anticipated that could be obligated in FY 2011 for both the near-term and long-term efforts. We are asking the business line leads to coordinate with supporting offices and submit a response by business line and by office. Please send your responses to me and Liz Jacobs-Baynard and copy Jennifer Golder and George Smolik, OCFO NLT than Noon on Tuesday.

## TEPCO may scrap all six reactors at quakehit nuclear plant

Tokyo Electric Power Co. (TEPCO) is likely to permanently close all of the six reactors at its stricken Fukushima nuclear power plant, according to sources in the company.

While it would be practically impossible to resume operations at the four reactors crippled in the Great East Japan Earthquake, the No. 5 and No. 6 reactors have not been seriously damaged. Theoretically, TEPCO could continue using them for power generation.

But a TEPCO source said that was unlikely. "Taking into consideration the sentiments of local residents, it will be difficult to resume operations (at the No. 5 and No. 6 reactors) and scrapping all the six reactors is inevitable," the source said.

Fuel rods in the cores of the No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 reactors and spent fuel rods in storage pools at the No. 3 and No. 4 reactors are thought to have been damaged in the present crisis.

At the No. 1, No. 3 and No. 4 reactors, the buildings housing the core containment vessel and a core pressure container have been wrecked by hydrogen explosions. A hydrogen explosion at the No. 2 reactor is believed to have damaged a suppression pool connected to the core containment vessel.

It could take nearly a decade to decommission the damaged reactors, one source in the company said.

TEPCO employees believe there is a strong chance that they will be unable to remove the damaged fuel rods from the core pressure containers in the stricken plant's No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 reactors.

Because of the threat of radiation from the damaged fuel rods, the disposal process is likely to take years, they explained.

An official said: "It will take nearly 10 years to scrap the reactors."

At a news conference Sunday, Chief Cabinet Secretary Yukio Edano said resumption of power generation at the plant would be almost impossible.

"Looking at the situation objectively, there is no clear way in which one can see (TEPCO) restarting operations (at the Fukushima plant)."

Masao Hara, mayor of Koriyama in Fukushima Prefecture, said Saturday that the central government and TEPCO should be working on the assumption that the Fukushima No. 1 plant will be scrapped.

The mayor said he conveyed his request to industry minister Banri Kaieda on the phone. He said Kaieda replied that he would take the request seriously.

## **Emergency Response Governmental Decision and Recommendation Information Exchange**

A key issue in any nuclear emergency is the need to keep decision makers informed of the details of the quickly evolving situation. One aspect of such an evolution is that countries will make decisions regarding advice to their own citizens, regarding their own imports and exports, regarding their own industries, etc.

For this reason, I discussed today (17 March) with the Inter-Agency Committee on Response to Nuclear Emergencies (IACRNE) the idea of trying to collect a kind of "database" of decisions and recommendations that have been made by various governments at this early stage of the situation, and to try to update and modify this database as long as this remains of use to you. The IACRNE meeting today agreed that this information would be very useful, and mandated the NEA to try to put this together. The EC reported that for its member countries the ECURIE system has been used to collect this information, and as such I have asked Augustin Janssens to provide decisions and recommendations for European countries, so as to avoid double reporting (and double work).

To begin, then, I would like to know whether your governments have made recommendations with regard to your citizens in Japan, with regard to food or goods coming from Japan, with regard to your citizens going to Japan. Sample questions are given in the attached table.

I would also like to know if you have any other questions you would like to have asked in this regard, concerning other types of decisions or recommendations that would be of use to your government in the context of the current situation.

Please send me any information regarding your published governmental positions, and any new questions for which you would like to have input. I will make sure that the CRPPH constituency, as well as the IAEA and the other IACRNE member organizations, are kept informed of all results I am able to collect.

#### Kathy:

Below is a better response. It addressed not only the affects of sea water on fission products chemistry in the reactor coolant system and the spent fuel pool, but also address potential of plugging.

There do not appear to be serious downsides to the use of seawater. The Paul Scherer Institute (Switzerland) experiments have investigated effects of salt on aqueous iodine chemistry and had not seen much effect.

We see CII (Cholrine iodide) rather than I2 partitioning from salt solutions but iodine partitioning is about the same. There will be some organic iodide formation because of the organic in seawater. Seawater pH will typically be less than 7, but boration will change the pH presumably to a higher value and this will suppress iodine partitioning from the water into the gas phase. Any silver will precipitate, but in BWRs there is only fission product silver and this does not have a high yield. We can presume the seawater is saturated in carbon dioxide. This may precipitate any barium or strontium in the water as a carbonate.

Again, we do not expect a big effect such as plugging etc. There will be enhanced corrosion of the cladding and the steel, but these are very long term effects and not of particular interest now.

I don't think we need to worry about iodine in the spent fuel pools. The fuel is old enough that we are well beyond 10 half lives for the most important iodine isotopes. The only significant iodine iodine isotope is I-129 which has a very long half life and consequently a minuscule radioactivity in comparison to other things such as noble gases and cesium.

The Chairman has requested for the NRC to conduct a Near-term (90 day effort) and a longer-term review (as discussed by Bill B at the Commission meeting today) of regulatory issues affecting U.S. operating reactors based on the events in Japan. The Chairman is interested in seeking supplemental funding to support our efforts for the above effort, in addition to NRC's costs associated with emergency response and technical experts sent to Japan. OCFO is preparing cost data associated with emergency response and technical support to Japan.

On Friday, the OCFO requested some initial estimates to support the reviews (see attached). At this time, we are requesting the offices to review these initial estimates and include some information concerning the work that is envisioned to support these reviews. Listed below are some initial thoughts about the scope of the near-term and long-term reviews. Also, consider what on-going efforts related to the development of our regulatory program could benefit with supplemental funding. For example, it was mentioned in the Commission meeting that NRC is currently working on GSI-199. Should funding be accelerated for this effort and others of this nature.

#### Near Term Review (90 day effort):

- Evaluate currently available technical and operational information from the Japan event to identify near-term (or immediate) operational or regulatory issues affection U.S. operating reactors of all designs in areas such as protection against earthquakes, tsunami, flooding, hurricanes, station blackout and a degraded ability to restore power; severe accident mitigation and emergency preparedness
- Develop recommendations for generic communications, orders, changes to inspection procedures and licensing review guidance, etc.
- Possibly prepare a 30 day quick look report

#### Longer-Term Review (Following obtaining sufficient technical information from the Japan event)

- Evaluate all technical and policy issues related to the event to identify additional research, generic issues, changes to the reactor oversight process, rulemakings and adjustments to the regulatory framework that should be conducted by the NRC.
- Evaluate interagency issues such as emergency preparedness.
- Applicability of the lessons learned to non-operating reactor and non-reactor facilities.

It is recognized that the full scope of the reviews has yet to be determined or the size of the group that will be conducting the analysis. Therefore, we are looking only for rough cost estimates. You are requested to send the level of funding (dollars and FTE) that is anticipated that could be obligated in FY 2011 for both the near-term and long-term efforts. We are asking the business line leads to coordinate with supporting offices and submit a response by business line and by office. Please send your responses to me and Liz Jacobs-Baynard and copy Jennifer Golder and George Smolik, OCFO NLT than Noon on Tuesday.

In my opinion, the <u>Japan Atomic Industrial Forum</u> is one of the best sources of information on the status of the plants at Fukushima. Updates are posted here a few times during the day. The <u>most recent update</u> is a couple hours old; Tokyo is 13 hours ahead.

The overall situation has been fairly stable for a few days. Offsite AC has been connected to the site, but there are challenges to ensure equipment can be safely energized. Some of the process parameter information in the update is suspect. For example, the report shows the Unit 2 and 3 containments at below atmospheric pressure, and I don't think indicated core water levels have moved from an indication that the fuel is uncovered, even though it is my understanding that water is being provided in excess of the decay heat load, so the core should be full of water. That's my personal opinion, not an official agency point of view, so it's worth what you're paying for it.

I suspect that the water level numbers on page three refer to RPV downcomer level. Negative numbers here and quoted in absolute units would indicate relative to: (a) bottom of the narrow range instrument band or (2) top of active fuel (TAF) as a reference. In BDB/SA space, it is conventional to reference level to bottom of the narrow range band (instrument 0). I imagine that the (A) and (B) refer to instrumentation channels or to wide range and narrow range indication, either way I would just say that they are two different instrument readings. It would appear across Units 1,2, and 3 that the RPV level is approximately 1.5 m below narrow range instrument 0.

Instrument 0 is typically ~170 inches above TAF.

Level below TAF does not necessarily mean that the core is not cooled. The downcomer level provides a density head to drive two-phase flow through the core. A level below the TAF in many cases is sufficient to provide two-phase cooling above the height of the downcomer level. Additionally, if level is far below the TAF, steam-cooling may also be effective in cooling the reactor fuel.

For ATWS, RPV level may be intentionally dropped to TAF-2 (TAF minus 2 feet) and in SA space, the level may be maintained at a level referred to as the minimum steam cooling reactor water level (MSCRWL, generally TAF minus ~30 inches).

If level is ~1.5 m (~60 inches) below instrument 0, it remains above the TAF. The ~2.4 m number (95 inches) would still be above TAF if referenced to instrument 0.

If the reference is to TAF, then 60 inches below TAF is below the MSCRWL and 95 inches below is likely below even core midplane. These numbers would be congruent with the assessment that the core would be damaged due to inadequate core cooling.

In response, all BWRs with Mark I containments that didn't have an existing strengthened or "hardened" pathway for venting directly from primary containment to the outside, made modifications to the plant consistent with the intent of the Generic Letter.

To Whom It May Concern in the United States and Japanese Governments

Bechtel Group, Inc.'s nearly 40,000 employees extend their deepest condolences to Japan for the loss of life and property caused last week by the devastating earthquake and tsunami.

Because we appreciate the urgency of the situation and the humanitarian consequences, we are prepared to provide *immediate* professional assistance on a pro-bono basis in the following areas that match our expertise: (1) stabilizing and planning for decontaminating and decommissioning the Fukushima nuclear units; and (2) creating and launching a plan to recover essential infrastructure in the devastated area (including but not limited to temporary electricity, shelter for evacuees, water + waste-water, port(s), highways + bridge(s), rail line(s), telecommunications, removal of debris, etc.).

These services would be pro-bono as I mentioned but would be on the following basis:

d) That a complete release, hold-harmless, and indemnification of Bechtel from any liability in all respects in connection with this volunteer pro-bono assistance is provided to Bechtel.

Bechtel has been a leading engineer constructor for the last 113 years, was the fifth largest in the world and largest in the United States in 2010, is a premier nuclear engineer and constructor, and has worked on a number of GE BWR projects over the years. Bechtel has worked in Japan closely with many of Japan's major contractors for many years and is currently working with some globally, and has unique experience with which to help Japan in this time of need. - Bechtel undertook reconstruction of most of Iraq's critical infrastructure (other than oil and gas facilities) under contract for USAID 2003 2006 under very difficult conditions. TOHOKU-TAIHEIYOU-OKI EARTHQUAKE EFFECTS ON JAPANESE NUCLEAR POWER

**PLANTS** 

#### **ADDRESSEES**

All holders of or applicants for operating licenses for nuclear power reactors under the provision of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 50, "Domestic Licensing of Production and Utilization Facilities," except those who have permanently ceased operations and have certified that fuel has been permanently removed from the reactor vessel.

All holders of or applicants for a standard design certification, standard design approval, manufacturing license, limited work authorization, early site permits or combined license issued under 10 CFR Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants."

#### **PURPOSE**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is issuing this information notice (IN) to inform addressees of effects of the Tohoku-Taiheiyou-Oki Earthquake on nuclear power plants in Japan. The NRC expects that recipients will review the information for applicability to their facilities and consider actions, as appropriate, to avoid similar problems. Suggestions contained in this IN are not NRC requirements; therefore, no specific action or written response is required.

#### **DESCRIPTION OF CIRCUMSTANCES**

The following summary of events is provided based on the best information available at this time. The situation in Japan regarding recovery efforts for the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station continues to evolve on an hourly basis.

On March 11, 2011, the Tohoku-Taiheiyou-Oki Earthquake occurred near the east coast of Honshu, Japan. This magnitude 9.0 earthquake and the subsequent tsunami caused significant damage to at least four of the six units of the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power station as the result of a sustained loss of both the offsite and on-site power systems. Efforts to restore power to emergency equipment have been hampered or impeded by damage to the surrounding areas due to the tsunami and earthquake.

#### ML110760432

Units 1 through 3, which had been operating at the time of the earthquake, scrammed automatically, inserting their neutron absorbing control rods to ensure immediate shutdown of the fission process. Following the loss of electric power to normal and emergency core cooling systems and the subsequent failure of back-up decay heat removal systems, water injection into the cores of all three reactors was compromised, and reactor water levels could not be maintained. Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO), the operator of the plant, resorted to injecting sea water and boric acid into the reactor vessels of these three units, in an effort to cool the fuel and ensure the reactors remained shutdown. However, the fuel in the reactor cores became partially uncovered. Hydrogen gas built up in Units 1 and 3 as a result of exposed, overheated fuel reacting with water. Following gas venting from the primary containment to relieve pressure, hydrogen explosions occurred in both units and damaged the secondary containments. It appears that primary containments for Units 1 and 3 remain functional, but the primary containment for Unit 2 may be damaged. TEPCO cut a hole in the side of the Unit 2 secondary containment to prevent hydrogen buildup following a sustained period when there was no water injection into the core.

In addition, Units 3 and 4 have low spent fuel pool (SFP) water levels. Efforts continue to supply seawater to the SFPs for Units 1 through 4 using various methods. At this time, the integrity of the SFPs for Units 3 and 4 is unknown.

Fukushima Daiichi Units 4 through 6 were shutdown for refueling outages at the time of the earthquake. The fuel assemblies for Unit 4 had been offloaded from the reactor core to the SFP. The SFPs for Units 5 and 6 appear to be intact, but the temperature of the pool water appears to be increasing. Emergency power is available to provide cooling water flow through the SFPs for Units 5 and 6.

The Japanese Government ordered an evacuation out to 20 km for the area surrounding Fukushima Daiichi. Residents out to 30 km were ordered to shelter in place.

The damage to Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power station appears to have been caused by initiating events outside of the design basis for the facilities.

#### **BACKGROUND**

10 CFR Part 50, Appendix A, "General Design Criteria for Nuclear Power Plants," General Design Criterion (GDC) 2, "Design Bases for Protection against Natural Phenomena," or similar appropriate requirements in the licensing basis for a reactor facility, requires that structures, systems, and components (SSCs) important to safety be designed to withstand the effects of natural phenomena such as earthquakes, tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, tsunami, and seiches without loss of capability to perform their safety functions. The design bases for these SSCs reflect: (1) appropriate consideration of the most severe of the natural phenomena that have been historically reported for the site and surrounding area, with sufficient margin for the limited accuracy, quantity, and period of time in which the historical data have been accumulated, (2) appropriate combinations of the effects of normal and accident conditions with the effects of the natural phenomena, and (3) the importance of the safety functions to be performed.

As a result of the terrorist events of September 11, 2001, the NRC issued EA-02-026, "Order for Interim Safeguards and Security Compensatory Measures" (the ICM Order) dated February 25, 2002. The ICM Order, which is designated as Safeguards Information (SGI), modified thenoperating licenses for commercial power reactor facilities to require compliance with specified interim safeguards and security compensatory measures. Section B.5.b of the ICM Order requires licensees to adopt mitigation strategies using readily available resources to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and SFP cooling capabilities to cope with the loss of large areas of the facility due to large fires and explosions from any cause, including beyond-design-basis aircraft impacts.

By letter, dated February 25, 2005, the NRC staff provided guidance for implementing Section B.5.b of the ICM Order. This guidance, designated as SGI, included best practices for mitigating losses of large areas of the plant and measures to mitigate fuel damage and minimize releases. Following issuance of the B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance, the NRC staff conducted inspections at operating reactor sites using Temporary Instruction (TI) 2515/164 (SGI) and subsequently TI 2515/168 (SGI) to ensure compliance with Section B.5.b of the ICM Order.

In December 2006, the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) issued NEI 06-12, Revision 2, "B.5.b Phase 2 & 3 Submittal Guideline." NEI 06-12 is designated for Official Use Only – Security Related Information (OUO-SRI). The NRC endorsed NEI 06-12, Revision 2, by letter dated December 22, 2006, also designated OUO-SRI, as an acceptable means for developing and implementing the mitigation strategies requirement in Section B.5.b of the ICM Order. NEI 06-12, Revision 2, provides guidance for implementing a set of strategies intended to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and SFP cooling capabilities under the circumstances associated with the loss of a large area of the plant due to explosions or fire. NEI 06-12 provides guidance in the following areas:

- Adding make-up water to the SFP,
- Spraying water on the spent fuel,
- Enhanced initial command and control activities for challenges to core cooling and containment, and
- Enhanced response strategies for challenges to core cooling and containment.

The specific strategies covered in NEI 06-12, Revision 2, were developed based on the results of assessments conducted at currently licensed power reactor facilities for the purpose of enhancing plant specific mitigation capability for damage conditions caused by a large explosion or fire. These assessments identified a wide spectrum of potential plant specific strategies. NEI 06-12, Revision 2, specifies one set of strategies applicable to all pressurized-water reactors and another set applicable to all boiling-water reactors. Both sets are derived from the results of the plant specific assessments.

The B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance and NEI 06-12, Revision 2, were used by each licensee in preparing information submitted to the NRC that describes a plant specific approach to implementing mitigating strategies and supports each plant specific license condition. The NRC staff has completed its review of the information submitted by each licensee, as well as information obtained during prior NRC inspections, and has issued an OUO-SRI safety

evaluation (SE) that documents the bases for its approval of the license condition for each facility. The SE issued for each licensee includes regulatory guidance in Section 3.0 of Appendix A, "Phase 1 Assessment," that recites the generic B.5.b Phase 1 Guidance of Reference 3, as clarified in TI 2515/168, in a form that is designated OUO-SRI rather than SGI.

By publishing new requirements in the Federal Register dated March 27, 2009 (74 FR 13926), the NRC amended 10 CFR Part 50, 10 CFR Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications, and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants," and 10 CFR Part 73, "Physical Protection of Plants and Materials." This rulemaking added paragraph (i) to 10 CFR 50.34, "Contents of Applications; Technical Information," and paragraph (d) to 10 CFR 52.80 " Contents of Applications; Additional Technical Information," to require submittal of a "description and plans for implementation of the guidance and strategies intended to maintain or restore core cooling, containment, and spent fuel pool cooling capabilities under the circumstances associated with the loss of large areas of the plant due to explosions or fire as required by § 50.54(hh)(2) of this chapter." This rulemaking also added 10 CFR 50.54(hh)(2) to impose the same mitigating strategies requirements on all reactor applicants and licensees as those imposed by the ICM Order and associated license conditions. The Statement of Considerations for this rulemaking specifically noted that the requirements in 10 CFR 50.54(hh) are intended to address certain events that are the cause of large fires and explosions that affect a substantial portion of the nuclear power plant and are not limited or directly linked to an aircraft impact. In addition, the rule contemplates that the initiating event for such large fires and explosions could be any number of beyond-design basis events. Such events include natural phenomena such as those described in GDC 2 (i.e., earthquakes, tornadoes, floods, tsunami, and seiches), without regard to the GDC 2 provisions governing the severity of natural phenomena.

NRC regulations at 10 CFR 50.63, "Loss of All Alternating Current Power," require that light-water-cooled nuclear power plants be capable of withstanding for a specified duration and recovering from a station blackout.

#### DISCUSSION

The nuclear power industry has taken the actions listed below at each licensed reactor site. Additional information is available in the NEI Fact Sheet, "Industry Taking Action to Ensure Continued Safety at U.S. Nuclear Energy Plants," dated March 16, 2011, available at <a href="https://www.nei.org">www.nei.org</a>.

- verification of the capability to mitigate conditions that result from severe adverse events, including the loss of significant operational and safety systems due to natural events, fires, aircraft impact and explosions
- 2. verification of the capability to mitigate a total loss of electric power to a nuclear power plant
- 3. verification of the capability to mitigate flooding and the impact of floods on systems inside and outside the plant
- 4. identification of the potential for loss of equipment functions during seismic events appropriate for the site and the development of mitigating strategies to address potential vulnerabilities

NRC assessment of the implications of beyond design-basis natural phenomena is continuing as more information becomes available. The NRC staff is currently developing a TI to guide staff in performing independent assessments of nuclear power plant readiness to address beyond design-basis natural phenomena under the Reactor Oversight Process. The NRC is considering additional generic communications and additional action including requesting operating plants to provide specific information relating to their facilities to enable the NRC staff to complete a regulatory assessment of beyond design basis phenomena.

The Chairman has requested for the NRC to conduct a Near-term (90 day effort) and a longer-term review (as discussed by Bill B at the Commission meeting today) of regulatory issues affecting U.S. operating reactors based on the events in Japan. The Chairman is interested in seeking supplemental funding to support our efforts for the above effort, in addition to NRC's costs associated with emergency response and technical experts sent to Japan. OCFO is preparing cost data associated with emergency response and technical support to Japan.

On Friday, the OCFO requested some initial estimates to support the reviews (see attached). At this time, we are requesting the offices to review these initial estimates and include some information concerning the work that is envisioned to support these reviews. Listed below are some initial thoughts about the scope of the near-term and long-term reviews. Also, consider what on-going efforts related to the development of our regulatory program could benefit with supplemental funding. For example, it was mentioned in the Commission meeting that NRC is currently working on GSI-199. Should funding be accelerated for this effort and others of this nature.

## Near Term Review (90 day effort):

- Evaluate currently available technical and operational information from the Japan event to identify near-term (or immediate) operational or regulatory issues affection U.S. operating reactors of all designs in areas such as protection against earthquakes, tsunami, flooding, hurricanes, station blackout and a degraded ability to restore power; severe accident mitigation and emergency preparedness
- Develop recommendations for generic communications, orders, changes to inspection procedures and licensing review guidance, etc.
- Possibly prepare a 30 day quick look report

# Longer-Term Review (Following obtaining sufficient technical information from the Japan event)

- Evaluate all technical and policy issues related to the event to identify additional research, generic issues, changes to the reactor oversight process, rulemakings and adjustments to the regulatory framework that should be conducted by the NRC.
- Evaluate interagency issues such as emergency preparedness.
- Applicability of the lessons learned to non-operating reactor and non-reactor facilities.

It is recognized that the full scope of the reviews has yet to be determined or the size of the group that will be conducting the analysis. Therefore, we are looking only for rough cost estimates. You are requested to send the level of funding (dollars and FTE) that is anticipated that could be obligated in FY 2011 for both the near-term and long-term efforts. We are asking the business line leads to coordinate with supporting offices and submit a response by business line and by office. Please send your responses to me and Liz Jacobs-Baynard and copy Jennifer Golder and George Smolik, OCFO NLT than Noon on Tuesday.

#### **REGULATION & SAFETY:**

Radiation trends in Japan

21 March 2011

Radiation levels in the wider area around the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant trended downwards for several days, but have recently increased on rainfall. Contamination of food appears limited at present.

Work on Fukushima Daiichi power connections

21 March 2011

Workers continued to restore external power to the stricken Fukushima Daiichi units, although work was briefly interrupted when smoke was seen coming from unit 3. Efforts at the plant have been helped by assistance from both domestic and foreign companies.

Stabilisation at Fukushima Daiichi

20 March 2011

Workers on site have succeeded in increasing the stability of the Fukushima Daiichi reactors, with units 5 and 6 now in cold shutdown. Pressure built up within unit 3 but a more significant venting does not seem necessary now.

Food samples show raised radioactivity

19 March 2011

Levels of radioactivity exceeding the Japanese government-set level have been detected in samples of milk and spinach collected in the region of the Fukushima nuclear power plant. However, the levels measured are said to pose no immediate threat to health.

Fuel pond work at Fukushima

19 March 2011

Recent work at Fukushima Daiichi has included making holes to allow hydrogen to disspate from fuel ponds at units 5 and 6, while unit 3's fuel pond is said to have stabilised.

Spraying continues at Fukushima Daiichi

18 March 2011

Spraying of reactor buildings continued at Fukushima Daiichi today, while workers tried to make a connection to a nearby transmission line. At least some water was supplied to ponds yesterday, but how much is not known.

UK advisor reassures on contamination fears 18 March 2011

The UK government's chief independent scientific advisor has told the British Embassy in Tokyo that radiation fears from the stricken Fukushima nuclear power plant are a "sideshow" compared with the general devastation caused by the massive earthquake and tsunami that struck on 11 March.

Insight to Fukushima engineering challenges

18 March 2011

Official notices of the accidents at the Fukushima nuclear power plants give insight into the challenges faced by power plant engineers in the aftermath of last week's natural disasters.

Progress by on-site workers

17 March 2011

The high levels of radiation braved by workers at the scene in Fukushima Daiichi appear to have reduced after the expansion of the workforce and announcements of infrastructure improvements to come.

Attempts to refill fuel ponds

17 March 2011

A major struggle took place today to maintain cooling of used nuclear fuel at Fukushima Daiichi 3 and 4. Helicopters made water drops and large fire trucks showered the buildings. Initial indications are that the effort was successful.

Problems for units 3 and 4

16 March 2011

Chief cabinet secretary Yukio Edano has described problems that occurred on the morning of 16 March with Fukushima Daiichi 3 and 4, as well as plans to pump water into unit 4.

Radiation decreasing, fuel ponds warming

15 March 2011

Loud noises were heard at Fukushima Daiichi 2 this morning and a major component beneath the reactor may be damaged. Evacuation to 20 kilometres is being completed, while radiation levels decrease from a high in the morning. Concern is growing over the status of fuel cooling ponds at units 4, 5 and 6.

#### CORPORATE:

Billion-euro nuclear shutdown in Germany

16 March 2011

The German government has declared a three-month moratorium on nuclear power, in which eight reactors will stay offline, checks will take place and nuclear policy may be reconsidered.

#### INDUSTRY TALK:

Australia confident for uranium future

21 March 2011

Australia's uranium sales are not likely to be affected by a period of uncertainty as governments and reactor operators seek to learn lessons from the emergency at the Fukushima reactors in Japan, according to Australian Uranium Association CEO Michael Angwin.

ARMZ pulls back from acquisition

18 March 2011

The \$1.2 billion acquisition of emerging uranium mining company Mantra Resources by Russia's AtomRedMetZoloto (ARMZ) is in doubt following the serious events at the Fukushima nuclear power plants in Japan.

Application submitted for Swedish repository

17 March 2011

Nuclear fuel company SKB has applied for permission to build Sweden's first repository for used nuclear fuel. SKB has also applied for permission to build a plant to encapsulate the

fuel prior to disposal.

Groundbreaking for first UAE reactor

17 March 2011

A groundbreaking ceremony has been held for the United Arab Emirates' first nuclear power plant at Braka. The 14 March ceremony was attended by South Korean president Lee Myung-bak and Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, crown prince of Abu Dhabi.

Korea sends boric acid supplies

16 March 2011

The South Korean government said today it is sending boric acid supplies to Japan to use in efforts to stabilise stricken nuclear reactors. Boron is an efficient neutron absorber that can be injected in to the core of a nuclear reactor to inhibit nuclear reactions.

All Fukushima Daini units in cold shutdown

15 March 2011

All four units at the Fukushima Daini nuclear power plant have now achieved cold shutdown - where coolant water is at less than 100°C - with full operation of cooling systems, Tepco reported.





# **Generic Pressurized Water Reactor (PWR)**


Primary and secondary system are isolated from one another.

# **Generic Boiling Water Reactor (BWR)**


BWRs actually boil the primary water to make turbine steam.




**Cutaway of Boiling Water Reactor (BWR)**

NUREG/CR-6890, "Reevaluation of Station Blackout Risk at Nuclear Power Plants," (<a href="http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/contract/cr6890/">http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/contract/cr6890/</a>) is the most recent update regarding SBO

Unknown. However, our understanding is that NUREG-1776 (http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/staff/sr1776/) is the most recent study specific to the station blackout rule that has been prepared by RES.

# "Coping time in hours" – is that the amount of battery power? And is it the amount the plant has, or is required to have?

- 10 CFR 50.63, "Loss of all alternating current power," requires that the station blackout duration shall be based on (i) redundancy of the onsite emergency power ac power sources; (2) the reliability of the onsite emergency ac power sources; (3) the expected frequency of loss of offsite power; and (4) the probably time needed to restore offsite power. RG 1.155, "Station Blackout," (August 1988), provides guidance for determining a plant specific coping time based on these factors. In general, coping times range from 2 to 16 hours, though licensees may propose alternate durations based on plant specific factors relating to the reliability of their ac power systems.
- Licensees must demonstrate that systems have sufficient capacity and capability to ensure core cooling
  and containment integrity are maintained for the duration of the specified coping time. The capability for
  coping with a SBO of specified duration must be determined by a coping analysis. Although station
  batteries are one of the necessary systems, other systems that provide water inventory and containment
  functions must also be available..

For Dual unit site, 2 loss of power events on each unit is counted as 4 events. Do not understand question



On the site you put MELCOR cals for a Mark I showing results of a LT SBO thru the time of containment failure, it appears it was taken from the SOARCA work.

Note some uncertainties have not been quantified, particularly I proposed the following scoping study to be performed years ago:

Specifically for BWRs, it appears during the melt progression we are under estimating the potential for "surrounding" metals to be added to the melt, if enough metal is added to the melt the thermal inertia and fission product evolution may be affected. For example, this aspect could affect Mark I containment failure timing cased by liner melt-through. Currently for BWRs, the external lower head structures such as CRDM, supports etc. are not modeled in the MELCOR state-of-the-art model, these components have significant mass and may fragment the melt front, moreover, the calculated temperatures of the steam separators are high enough to collapse these structures, also adding to the melt.

Just to make you aware of this, there are more complexities in the details... by the way the RES ranking process did not push to pursue this....Allen

On page 8 of the guidance it says "where an email contains the exchange between two or more offices, the submitting office is responsible for making a disclosure determination on the portions of the email originated by its staff and the indicating the originating offices for the remaining portions" Does this mean if we received an email from an another office we don't have to submit that email- because the other office originated it?

Does the above statement also apply for emails between staff in the same office? Are emails between staff in the same office covered in this FOIA?

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# GENERIC ISSUE 199, "IMPLICATIONS OF UPDATED PROBABILISTIC SEISMIC HAZARD ESTIMATES IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN UNITED STATES ON EXISTING PLANTS"

#### Objective of GI-199

The objective of the GI-199 Safety/Risk Assessment was to perform a conservative, screening-level assessment to evaluate if further investigations of seismic safety for operating reactors in the central and eastern U.S. (CEUS) was warranted consistent with NRC directives.

- Results of the GI-199 safety risk assessment are not final estimates of plant-specific seismic risk.
- The seismic hazard data and plant-level fragility assumptions were conservative estimates useful as a screening tool.
- The NRC does not rank plants by seismic risk.

#### Key Messages:

- Safety/Risk Assessment for GI-199 was completed in August 2010. It is publically available in ADAMS at ML100270582.
- Plants have adequate safety margin for seismic issues and are within their licensing basis.
- Overall seismic risk estimates remain small and adequate protection is maintained.
- Updates to seismic data and models indicate increased seismic hazard estimates for some operating nuclear power plant sites in the Central and Eastern United States.
- NRC has separate criteria for immediate action and for evaluating whether plant improvements may be imposed through a back-fit.
- The Safety/Risk Assessment used readily available information and found that for about one-quarter of the currently operating plants, the change in seismic hazard is enough to warrant further review.
- Action may include obtaining additional, updated information and developing methods to determine if
  plant improvements to reduce seismic risk are warranted.

#### Status of Operating Plants and Need for Actions due to Japanese Event:



- Existing plants were designed with considerable margin to be able to withstand ground motions from the largest earthquake expected in the area around the plant.
- During the mid-to late-1990s, the NRC staff reassessed the margin beyond the design basis as part of the Individual Plant Examination of External Events [IPEEE] program.
- The NRC's GI-199 safety/risk assessment concluded that the probability of exceeding the design basis
  ground motion may have increased by a small amount at some plants. Those results also indicate that
  the increased risks are lower than NRC's guidelines for taking immediate action.
- US plants are designed for appropriate earthquake levels and are safe.

#### Timeline for Preparation and Issuance of Generic Letter:

W. 28 8



The NRC is conducting a regulatory assessment, which includes reviewing the seismic capacity for plants located in central and eastern United States based on the latest data and analysis techniques.

- NRC is working on developing a Generic Letter (GL) to request information from all affected plants (96 plants east of the Rockies).
- The GL is scheduled to be issued for public comment in the late spring 2011.
- Processes for review of the GL include a review by the NRC's Committee to Review Generic' Requirements, and a review by the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) both before and after the public comment period.
- GL should be issued by end of 2011, near the time the new consensus seismic hazard models become available.
- Consensus hazard models are being developed by NRC, DOE, and EPRI. In addition the USGS will
  review the model.
- Information requested from licensees will likely require 3 to 6 months to prepare. NRC's review will be on-going as information is collected.
- Based on NRC's review, a determination will be made regarding beneficial back-fits.

- The nature of the information used (both seismic hazard data and plant-level fragility information) make these estimates useful only as a screening tool. The NRC does not rank plants by seismic risk.

## Key Messages from the GI-199 Communications Plan (slightly revised) are:

- (1) In August 2010, the Safety/Risk Assessment for GI-199 was completed. That assessment found that operating nuclear power plants are safe: Plants have adequate safety margin for seismic issues. The NRC's Safety/Risk Assessment confirmed that overall seismic risk estimates remain small and that adequate protection is maintained.
- (2) Though still small, some seismic hazard estimates have increased: Updates to seismic data and models indicate increased seismic hazard estimates for some operating nuclear power plant sites in the Central and Eastern United States.
- (3) Assessment of GI-199 will continue: Plants are safe (see key message 1), but the NRC has separate criteria for evaluating whether plant improvements may be imposed. The NRC's Safety/Risk Assessment used readily available information and found that for about one-quarter of the currently operating plants, the estimated core damage frequency change is large enough to warrant further attention. Action may include obtaining additional, updated information and developing methods to determine if plant improvements to reduce seismic risk are warranted.

## Status of Operating Plants and Need of Additional Actions due to Japanese Event:

- Currently operating nuclear plants in the United States remain safe, with no need for immediate action.
- This determination is based on NRC staff reviews of updated seismic hazard information and the conclusions of the Generic Issue 199 Safety/Risk Assessment Panel.
- Existing plants were designed with considerable margin to be able to withstand the ground motions from the "deterministic" or "scenario earthquake" that accounted for the largest earthquake expected in the area around the plant.
- During the mid-to late-1990s, the NRC staff reassessed the margin beyond the design basis as part of the Individual Plant Examination of External Events (IPEEE) program.

- The results of the GI-199 assessment demonstrate that the probability of exceeding the design basis
  ground motion may have increased at some sites, but only by a relatively small amount. In addition,
  the Safety/Risk Assessment stage results indicate that the probabilities of seismic core damage are
  lower than the guidelines for taking immediate action.
- In summary, US plants are designed for appropriate earthquake levels and are safe. As addressed
  above, the NRC is conducting a program called Generic Issue 199, which is reviewing the adequacy of
  the earthquake design of US NPPs in central and eastern North America based on the latest data and
  analysis techniques. The NRC will look closely at all aspects of the response of the plants in Japan to
  the earthquake and tsunami to determine if any actions need to be taken in US plants and if any
  changes are necessary to NRC regulations.

### Timeline for Preparation and Issuance of GI-199 Generic Letter:

- The NRC is working on developing a Generic Letter (GL) to request information of all affected plants (96 plants that are east of the Rockies).
- The GL is planned to be issued in draft form within the next 2 months to stimulate discussions with industry in a public meeting.
- Process will be followed, i.e., Committee to Review Generic Requirements, Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards Meeting and then GL will be issued as a draft for formal public comments (60 days), followed by a second meeting with ACRS.
- We expect to issue the GL by the end of this calendar year, as the new consensus seismic hazard estimates become available. (This effort is being coordinated with US NRC, DOE, EPRI, and USGS).
- The information from licensees will likely require 3 to 6 months to complete. Staff's review will
  commence after receiving licensees' responses. Based on staff's review, a determination can be made
  regarding cost beneficial backfits where it can be justified.

(Frank N. von Hippel, a nuclear physicist, is a professor of public and international affairs at Princeton and co-chairman of the International Panel on Fissile Materials. From 1993 to 1994 he was responsible for national security issues in the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy.)

Fukushima also shows why we need to develop reactors that are more inherently safe. Almost all the world's power reactors, including those at Fukushima, are descended from the much smaller reactors developed in the 1950s by the United States for submarines. As we saw in the Fukushima accident, they depend on pumps to keep them from catastrophic failure, a major weak point. New designs less dependent on pumps have been developed, but there has not yet been enough research to make certain that they would work effectively.

One promising design is the high-temperature gas-cooled graphite reactor; its fuel is in the form of small particles surrounded by layers of material that could contain their radioactivity if a cooling system fails. The United States built two such prototypes in the 1960s, and Germany built one in the 1980s. With the virtual end of new reactor orders in the United States and Western Europe, as well as their small generating capacity compared to current water-cooled reactors, they were not pursued further.

China, however, which accounted for over 60 percent of the world's nuclear power plant construction during the past five years, is now planning two prototypes and, if these work, 36 more. Such a demonstration could help determine the commercial viability of gas-cooled graphite reactors worldwide, and the Department of Energy should offer the expertise of its national laboratories to help China make this effort a success.


