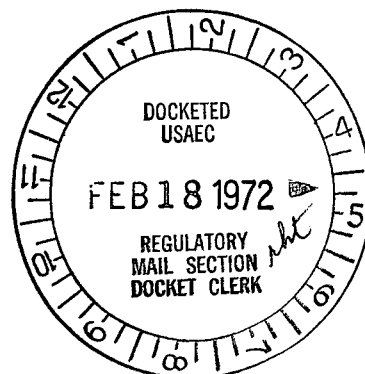
The enclosed staff report prepared by the Commission's Bureau of Power evaluates the effect of delay in facility construction upon the power needs to be served by the facility. These needs were considered from the standpoint of both the Applicants and the Iowa Power Pool of which the Applicants are a part. The report illustrates the need for the timely operation of the Center to serve the 1974 summer peak loads.
