The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is pleased that you will participate in a public Commission meeting on the Japan Near Term Task Force (NTTF) Report - Short-Term Actions, September 14, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. The meeting will be held in the Commissioners' Conference Room on the first floor of the NRC's Headquarters building at One White Flint North, Rockville, Maryland. The Commission is interested in hearing your input, representing industry, on potential short-term actions that should be implemented in light of the events associated with Fukushima regarding recommendations #9 of the NTTF report on requiring "facility emergency plans address prolonged station blackout and multiunit events." The NTTF report may be found on the NRC public website at http://pbadupws.nrc.gov/docs/ML1118/ML111861807.pdf, and a summary of the recommendations is listed on page 69-70. In the staff requirements memorandum on SECY-11-0093, the Commission directed the staff to provide two follow up papers on the short-term actions and prioritization of the recommendations: http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/commission/srm/2011/2011-0093srm.pdf The new paper on the short-term actions is due this Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, and the new paper on the prioritization is due October 3rd. As soon as the papers are publicly released, my staff will provide them to you.
