Dear Dr. Davenport:

This concerns your letter dated June 7, 2011 requesting an Amendment to your material license and our letter sent via electronic mail dated August 15, 2011 in which we notified you that the application was deficient and that certain additional information was required in order to list Dr. Robert J. Matthews as the Radiation Safety Officer (RSO). To date, we have not received a response to our letter. It is our understanding that you continue to work at Kootenai Medical Center as the RSO. Therefore, this request is voided without prejudice to the resubmission of future request. You can contact me at 817-276-6596 if you have any further questions.

Please note, that in order to add Dr. Matthews on the license as RSO he must be qualified for all of the material on the license. Therefore, you would have to demonstrate Dr. Matthews has training in radiation safety, regulatory issues and emergency procedures for all types of medical use currently on the license. This can be documented using the NRC Form 313A (RSO), specifically on page 3 using table 3.c. as stated in the letter dated August 15, 2011.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's document system (ADAMS).
