**Re:** Traffic Impact Analysis for Fermi EIS

J. Guerin asked whether Monroe County Road Commission had participated in the review of the *Traffic Study for the Fermi Nuclear Power Plant Unit 3 Expansion*, prepared by The Mannik & Smith Group, Inc. (2009), and whether the commission concurred with the analysis and recommendations to mitigate traffic impacts.

S. Assenmacher stated that he had been provided a copy of the report, and had conducted a cursory review to ensure that information presented was accurate. However, he recognized that the report was prepared for the permitting process, and that construction may be between 5 and 10 years away. Conditions may change between now and then; for example, the study would not have included the work being conducted on North Dixie Highway. He understood that Detroit Edison may not begin construction soon after receipt of the permit from NRC.

The Monroe County Road Commission is very interested in evaluating the impacts of the Fermi 3 construction on local roadways. All the roadways in the vicinity of Fermi 3 are county roadways. When Fermi 2 was constructed, North Dixie Highway was completely reconstructed. The commission will become involved in review of the project when the site plan has been received. No site plans have been submitted to Monroe County. The Monroe County Road Commission will be interested in traffic and also the affect of material and equipment transportation on the condition of the roads.
