8/12/2011 15:30 Ms. Kauffman spoke with Mr. Dickerson about the use of moisture density gauges by the company. She was referred to Jody Carriere for specific information about the gauge the company used to own. Mr. Carrier stated that the company used to own a Seamans gauge but it had been returned to the manufacturer. The company learned about the rule change where the NRC was taking over jurisdiction of radium-226 from the State of Vermont. After reviewing its options, the company determined licensure with the NRC would be prohibitively expensive for the amount of use the company was getting out of the gauge and returned the gauge. Mr. Carriere stated he would contact the manufacturer for more specific information.

9/29/2011 Mr. Carriere left a voice-mail message for Ms. Kauffman which indicated he had been in contact with the manufacturer who was sending him information about the gauge.

15:57 An e-mail from Harry Seaman, President of Seaman Corporation, was received by Mr. Carriere. The e-mail indicated that the gauge was a Seaman's Model C-200, Serial No. L-570 which contained a 4.5 millicuries of Radium-226/Beryllium as a sealed source. The gauge was received at Seaman's on October 21, 2009. The above described e-mail was forwarded to the NRC at 16:22 by Mr. Carriere. Mr. Courtemanche confirmed the above information by speaking to a representative of Seaman's.

9/30/2011 09:45 The receptionist stated that Mr. Dickinson would not be in until about 12:30. I left a voice-mail message for Mr. Dickinson to return my call.

12:45 Mr. Dickinson returned my call. I informed Mr. Dickinson that NRC management went over the information provided and decided to exercise discretion and not cite the company for possession of licensed material without a specific NRC license in accordance with the criteria of EGM 09-004. Mr. Dickinson inquired if there would be any civil penalty involved. I replied that there would not be any civil penalty or press release. Also, the company need not reply to the letter unless they wanted to provide additional information or correct a perceived error. The letter would be placed in ADAMS and would be able to be accessed by the public. I thanked Mr. Dickinson for his time.
