The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is pleased that you will participate in a public Commission meeting on the Japan Near Term Task Force (NTTF) Report – Prioritization of Recommendations, on October 11, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. The meeting will be held in the Commissioners' Conference Room on the first floor of the NRC's Headquarters building at One White Flint North, Rockville, Maryland. The Commission is interested in hearing your input on prioritization of the recommendations, including regulatory actions to be taken by the NRC staff and longer term evaluations, with a focus on recommendations #s 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the NTTF report.
