Memorial Hospital of Sheridan County respectfully requests to have certain and specific Authorized User privileges restored to one of our Physicians that appear to have been mistakenly removed in the form of a clerical error by the NRC during the course of amendment changes over the past several years.

I. On Amendment No. 24 dated June 29, 2004; Dr. Stamato is listed as being an Authorized User for "35.300 and 35.400".

II. On Amendment No. 25 dated April 7, 2006; Dr. Stamato is listed as being an Authorized User for "35.300 oral administration of sodium iodide I-131 and 35.400".

III. On Amendment No. 26 dated April 23, 2007; Dr. Stamato is listed as being an Authorized User for "Oral administration of sodium iodide I-131 and 35.400".

We have reviewed our correspondence with the NRC regarding these amendment requests, and as well the replies from the NRC responding to the same requests and it appears at no time should there have been any changes on our materials license with regard to Dr. Stamato's privileges as there is no mention of them by any either party.

We therefore request that Dr. John P. Stamato be fully restored to his original conditions of "for material identified in 10 CFR.300 and 35.400" as previously allowed by the NRC on Amendment No. 24.

Jason:

I have left in your chair Dr. Stamato's T&E documentation that I found in the historic file. Here's the chronology of Dr. Stamato's authorization.

1. Amendment 12 dated 4/23/1996: Dr. Stamato is not listed in the license.
2. Amendment 13 dated 9/30/1996: 35.400; P-32 as soluble phosphate for treatment of polycythemia vera, leukemia, and bone metastases and palliative treatment of bone metastases; Sr-89 as chloride for palliative treatment of metastatic bone pain.

(Note from Roberto: P-32 is intraperitoneal administration of unsealed byproduct material, Sr-89 is intravenous administration of unsealed byproduct material)

3. Amendment 14 dated 5/13/1997: 35.400; P-32 as soluble phosphate for treatment of polycythemia vera, leukemia, and bone metastases and palliative treatment of bone metastases; Sr-89 as chloride for palliative treatment of metastatic bone pain.
4. Amendment 15 dated 12/11/1997: 35.400; P-32 as soluble phosphate for treatment of polycythemia vera, leukemia, and bone metastases and palliative treatment of bone metastases; Sr-89 as chloride for palliative treatment of metastatic bone pain.
5. Amendment 16 dated 3/2/1998: 35.300; 35.400
6. Amendment 17 dated 4/26/2000: 35.300; 35.400
7. Amendment 20 (2001) to Amendment 24 (2004): 35.300; 35.400
8. Amendment 25 (2006): Oral administration of I-131; 35.400
9. Amendment 26 (2007, current amendment): Oral administration of I-131; 35.400

On letter dated September 10, 1996, the licensee requested to add Dr. Stamato as a 35.300 authorized user for P-32 and Sr-89 but excluding I-131, and as a 35.400 authorized user. Under the old Part 35, section 35.300 was called "Use of unsealed byproduct material for therapeutic administration", and 35.400 was and is still manual brachytherapy. Dr. Stamato has an American Board of Radiology certificate for Therapeutic Radiology, and completed 6 cases of administration of Sr-89, 8 cases of P-32, and 2 cases of Au-198. Amendment 13 was issued granting the authorization stated in Item 2.

On letter dated February 2, 1998, the licensee requested to expand Dr. Stamato's authorization to include the use of I-131. The licensee stated that Dr. Stamato fulfilled 35.930 (Training for therapeutic use of unsealed byproduct material), 35.932 (Training for treatment of hyperthyroidism), and 35.934. Dr. Stamato completed 11 cases of treatment for hyperthyroidism and 5 cases of treatment for thyroid carcinoma. Amendment 16 was issued granting the authorization to use I-131 and the authorization was changed from P-32 and Sr-89 only to "35.300".

With this information let sit down next week to discuss.

Roberto,

This pertains to the medical license we talked about (03013772/49-10982-02), where the AU's were allowed only "oral administration of sodium iodide I-131". It appears that on previous versions of the license, the AU was authorized for "35.300" with no limit on radionuclide or administration route. It wasn't clear on the docket why the restriction changed. It also wasn't clear what the AU's qualifications were to begin with.

I would appreciate assistance from the licensing staff to determine whether this AU was in fact qualified for any 35.300 activity, or if there was a valid reason to put the oral sodium iodide restriction. This may affect whether any violations are issued for this inspection.

The docket is on my desk if you or anyone else would like to look at it, I put some green sticky tabs on some of the documents that I though pertained to the AU's (Dr. Stomato) training, if it helps. I'm just not comfortable making the call myself that it was just an administrative mistake and he shouldn't have been changed to "oral administration of sodium iodide I-131". I would be happy to review the license with the reviewer to make sure we have a common understanding.

I'm out of the office until Tuesday, 9/13, but hope to let the license know where we're at sooner rather than later. Thanks for yours or any of the other licensing staff's help.

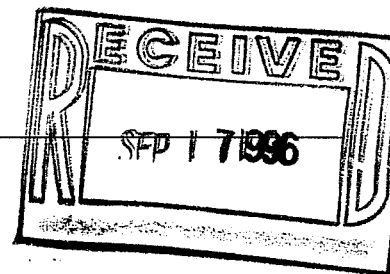

Gentlemen:

This letter is an attachment to my Supplement A and B Forms and is intended to clarify my hours of supervised experience as required by 10 CFR 35.940, Training for Use of Brachytherapy Sources.

As listed in Supplement B (preceptor statement), my training at Indiana University Medical Center under the supervision of an authorized user included a medical physics rotation (180 hours) and 49 patient cases involving brachytherapy radioisotopes. Based on a minimum of 7 hours per patient case, the casework was equivalent to at least 343 hours. My total supervised work experience was therefore at least 523 hours. Both the medical physics rotation and the patient casework included the following:

- (i) Ordering, receiving, and unpacking radioactive materials safely and performing the related radiation surveys;
- (ii) Checking survey meters for proper operation;
- (iii) Preparing, implanting, and removing sealed sources;
- (iv) Maintaining running inventories of material on hand;
- (v) Using administrative controls to prevent the misadministration of byproduct material; and
- (vi) Using emergency procedures to control byproduct materials

As also shown on the preceptor statement, I have three years of supervised clinical experience (7/1/93 - 6/30/96) at Indiana University Medical Center, including the Radiation Oncology Residency Program. This experience included:

- (i) Examining individuals and reviewing their case histories to determine their suitability for brachytherapy treatment, and any limitations or contraindications;
- (ii) Selecting the proper brachytherapy sources and dose and method of administration;
- (iii) Calculating the dose; and
- (iv) Post-administration followup and review of case histories in collaboration with the authorized user.

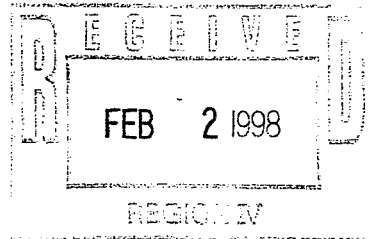

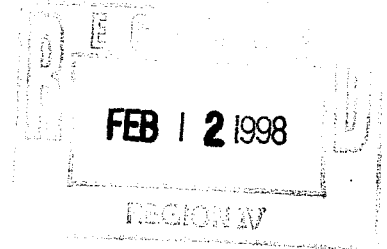

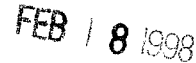
