Dear Mr. Klein:

This is in response to your letter of June 12, 1967, which expressed concern over the plans of the Northern States Power Company to construct and operate a nuclear power plant near Monticello, Minnesota.

On June 19, 1967, the Commission issued a construction permit to the company for this plant. Issuance of the permit was authorized in an initial decision by a three-man atomic safety and licensing board appointed by the Commission, which conducted a public hearing on the matter on May 25-26, 1967, in Buffalo, Minnesota. This hearing was held in the vicinity of the site of the plant in order to make it convenient for members of the public in the area to participate in the proceeding, to observe the AEC licensing process in operation, and to be informed of the measures taken to protect the public health and safety in the plant's operation.

All licensed nuclear power reactors are regulated by the AEC with respect to matters of radiological health and safety during their entire periods of operation. In addition to conducting in-depth safety reviews when applications are received for power reactor construction permits and operating licenses, the AEC carries out periodic inspections of these reactors during both the construction period and the operating period thereafter to assure that license conditions and the requirements of AEC regulations are being met. More detailed information on the licensing and regulation of nuclear power reactors, and the safety features provided in the design, construction and operation of these facilities is contained in the enclosed booklets, "Licensing of Power Reactors" and "Atomic Power Safety."

Since the AEC's regulatory functions are limited by law essentially to factors affecting the radiological health and safety of the public.


