

Dam Discharge Sweeps Youths Into River

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CHIPPEWA FALLS, — (P)
— Three Racine youths were swept off a rock on which they were standing in the Chippewa River at Jim Falls Saturday when a Northern States Power Co. dam was opened to let out water that had accumulated from recent heavy rains.

Authorities searched for Louis Cannon, 15, and Raymond Corn, 13. Raymond Golden, 12, was also swept into the water, but the current carried him to an island some 800 yards down-stream.

The Golden boy and Walter Foots, 45, of Racine, were hospitalized in fair condition at a hospital here. Foots dived into the water in a rescue attempt and was swept to the same island.

After dark, authorities called off their search for the Cannon and Corn boys and said it would resume today.
