SUBJECT: ISSUANCE OF LICENSE WITHOUT WAITING FOR  
EXPIRATION OF 30 DAYS PUBLIC NOTICE FOR EXPORT  
LICENSE PXB16.07

On August 10, 2011, Reviss Services Incorporated submitted an amendment to their combined export/import license PCB16.06-R. The application package was released to the public on August 10, 2011. Under normal procedure, this license would be issued on or after September 9, 2011.

On August 17, 2011, the NRC received an email request from Reviss Services Incorporated to amend their submission to add an additional ultimate consignee in Argentina. Since the addressee in Argentina was already listed the previous license as an importer, the email was not made available to the public in ADAMS within 6 days of receipt. The email is being put into ADAMS to correct this oversight.

OIP's license application review procedure normally allows for 30 days to lapse after the 10 CFR Section 110.70 notice is posted at the NRC Website. The Commission encourages written comments per 10 CFR Section 110.81 from the public regarding export and import license applications, and will consider, if appropriate, to respond to these comments. As specified in 10 CFR Section 110.82, NRC will consider an intervention petition or hearing request as timely if it is filed less than 30 days from the date an application is made available to the public.

OIP staff has completed its review and has concluded that issuing the amended export license (PXB16.07) is not inimical to the common defense and security. Should we receive any public feedback, it will be considered, as appropriate. We have informed the licensee of this possibility.
