Thank you. When you write "generally consistent," do you mean the wells may *not* be in the same place as indicated in the DEIS?

Is there a reason that stormwater ponds would be considered the domain of safety rather than environmental? It seems odd, given the importance placed on the ponds in the DEIS and in our contention, that the new stormwater pond locations would not be in shape files that you have.

I had the staff look at the shape files for the Scenario K well locations and it is the staff's opinion that the information provided in the EIS is generally consistent with the Scenario K wells (see figures 2-12 and 5-1 of the DEIS).

Brian has not been available for me to discuss the Ecology Party's request for shape files. However, I will inquire about any additional information on the well locations or if safety has shape files for the stormwater ponds.
