As you are aware, President Clinton issued a Memorandum on June 5, 1997, encouraging the use of Project Labor Agreements by all departments and agencies with regard to the award of contracts for the construction of a facility to be owned by a Federal department or agency. The President's Memorandum applies to projects which will cost more than \$5 million. Further, the Memorandum allows the use of Project Labor Agreements in leasehold arrangements and other federally funded projects.


The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations (Subcommittee) of the Committee on Education and the Workforce is responsible for ensuring the effective, efficient, and economical administration of all matters within its jurisdiction. Pursuant to Rules X and XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, please provide the Subcommittee written notice in the event you begin to contemplate using a Project Labor Agreement. In such event, please provide two copies of the following information:

- 1) a brief description of the project;
- 2) the estimated cost;
- 3) an explanation of the analysis used to determine how the Project Labor Agreement will advance the Government's interest in cost, efficiency, and quality; and
- 4) a copy of the request for proposals.

Please note that this request is continuing in nature.
