

## Couple of things to note:

- 1.) Kathy, note that Tab B cites the NRC appears to have referenced the SOARCA study to support a guideline. However, the Commission explicitly told the staff not to even speculate on how the SOARCA study could be used to revise our regulatory structure until we cleared it with them. Were we aware that it was being used for this report?
- 2.) Note in Tab C that NRC got it's SES certification for the next 2 years. That's a good thing!
- 3.) Mike, Tab D raises a concern about a offshore fault off the California coast. It asserts that an offshore fault discovered in 2008 has never been evaluated/assessed for its impact on Diablo Canyon. I thought we assessed this fault when it was discovered, and concluded it wasn't a problem? If my recollection is correct, and we were involved with the assessment, can you have your staff work with NRR as they prepare their response?
