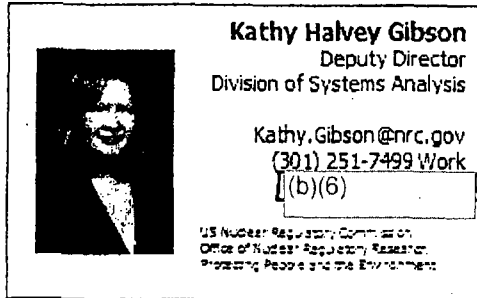

I found the bullets we used for SOARCA and cancer risk study in the past and combined them. I added one for Stephanie's comment on the new Commissioners, and the one from last quarter which is still true.

- Maintaining the "State-of-the-Art Reactor Consequence Analysis (SOARCA)" and "An Analysis of Cancer Risk in Populations Living Near Nuclear Power Facilities," studies on schedule and responding to the high stakeholder interest. Using effective risk communication techniques in ensuring internal and external stakeholders are aware of and can comment on the project schedules, milestones, and results in a timely and effective manner.
- Providing increased number of briefings and responses to questions for multiple new Commissioners.
- Prioritize competing resource demands and prepare staff and tools for highly uncertain emerging new work such as Toshiba (Liquid Metal Reactor) design certification scheduled for 2012, very long term spent fuel storage research, and licensing Mo-99 facilities.
