SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Offsite Radiological Emergency Preparedness
 (REP) Exercise at the Monticello Nuclear Power Station

Attached is a copy of the Final Report of the offsite radiological emergency preparedness exercise conducted on February 23, 1983, at the Monticello Nuclear Power Station. This was a full-scale exercise with participation by the State of Minnesota and Sherburne and Wright Counties.

The exercise report indicates that the exercise demonstrated an adequate level of offsite radiological emergency preparedness to ensure the health and safety of the public living in areas surrounding the Monticello Nuclear Power Station. Deficiencies identified at the Sherburne County Emergency Operations Center during the March 2, 1982, exercise regarding maps and other displays have been corrected. The February 23, 1983, exercise did identify several deficiencies requiring corrective actions. Attached is the State of Minnesota response with corrective actions for these deficiencies. This response has been determined by FEMA to be adequate.

In addition, a high level of interest by elected officials was demonstrated by an appearance during the exercise by the Governor and members of his staff, as well as two State Senators.

They operate regionally and would coordinate their responsibility with DES Regional Coordinator at the County EOC. Their responsibility is mainly closing State Parks within the EPZ.

Radiological exposure control measures for emergency workers were not adequately demonstrated. Low or mid-range dosimeters are needed, as well as TLD's and KI for emergency workers operating in the field. Also, proper instructions were not given to field personnel.

TLD's and KI are currently available to the emergency workers. TLD's are not distributed during an exercise to prevent exposure to sunlight, water, etc. which may cause an incorrect reading during an emergency. Low or mid-range dosimeters will be purchased this year. An extensive training program will be conducted this year to improve personnel capabilities.
