The licensee is a distributor of light bulbs containing Krypton (Kr) 85. The Licensee receives the light bulbs from its parent firm in Japan for distribution within the United States. These light bulbs contain krypton as an enhancement to light output. Material is possessed under a state of Ohio license. The license granted by the NRC is for distribution only and does not authorize possession of material.									
		Performance C	Observations						
Licensee demonstrated and discussed how the light bulbs are stored and accounted for in its inventory system. The licensee was able produce its record of the number of units shipped in the past twelve months for the inspectors. Interviews of the licensee's personnel indicated an adequate level of knowledge of radiation safety.									
The inspectors was able to verify that each unit containing Kr-85 was labeled in according with the licensee's license condition. The inspector took confirmatory survey and no radiation readings were above regulatory compliance limits. Licensee personnel are not required to wear dosimetry. No violations of requirements were noted.									
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
