This letter is in response to your request for additional information regarding our application for a Byproduct Material License. Control No. 576158. The following additional information is provided:

1. Enclose is a copy of a completed "Delegation of Authority" for the radiation safety Officer.
2. On the drawing of the department the "Hot Lab" is a counter top with storage cabinets. It is located in the Nuclear Medicine room. The door to the room is locked when the technologist is not in the room. A push button lock will be on the door. The materials in the hot lab area will be shielded in lead containers. In addition there will be a lead-glass shield, lead shielded sharp's containers, syringe shields, and lead shielded source containers.
3. Enclosed is a revised copy of the Item 10 commitment.

Subject: Delegation of Authority

You, ROY A. CARLSON, M.S., have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. You are responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program; identifying radiation protection problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you will spend 15 hours per week conducting radiation protection activities.
