Notification of Intention Regarding NRC Inspection Report 05000282/2011405(DRS);
05000306/2011405(DRS) (EA-11-203)

By letter dated December 7, 2011, (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML11341A122) the NRC transmitted Inspection Report 05000282/2011405(DRS); 05000306/2011405(DRS) for Prairie Island Nuclear Generating Plant (PINGP) Units 1 and 2. In the inspection report the NRC identified one finding that has the potential for significance of greater than very low security significance. In the December 7, 2011 letter (ADAMS Accession No. ML11341A122) the NRC also provided Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, doing business as Xcel Energy (hereafter "NSPM"), with the opportunity to request a Regulatory Conference or submit the NSPM position in writing.

NSPM appreciates the opportunity to meet with the NRC on this issue and by this letter requests a Regulatory Conference to present NSPM perspectives on the facts, assumptions and significance regarding the proposed finding. From the discussion in the December 7, 2011 letter (ADAMS Accession No. ML11341A122), NSPM understands that sensitive, security-related information may be discussed since a Regulatory Conference, if held, will not be open for public observation.
