

SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority

You, Malek Daneshvarnezhad, have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer from March 31 to April 8, 2012, and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. You are responsible for managing the radiation safety program; identifying radiation safety problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities, and ensuring compliance with regulations.


You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of radioactive material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified by radiation safety. You are required to notify management of situations where staff are not cooperating and not addressing radiation safety issues.

In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time.

**Appointment of Temporary Radiation Safety Program Change (35.24)
March 29, 2012**

From March 31 to April 8, 2012, Malek Daneshvarnezhad, is appointed as the Radiation Safety Officer of Beebe Medical Center.

Regulatory Justification:

In accordance with Subpart B of title 10 of Code of Federal Regulations-
§ 35.24 Authority and responsibilities for the radiation protection program.

For up to 60 days each year, a licensee may permit an authorized user or an individual qualified to be a Radiation Safety Officer, under §§ 35.50 and 35.59, to function as a temporary Radiation Safety Officer and to perform the functions of a Radiation Safety Officer, as provided in paragraph (g) 10 CFR 35.24, if the licensee takes the actions required in paragraphs (b), (e), (g), and (h) of this section and notifies the Commission in accordance with § 35.14(b).

35.50 & 35.59 Mr. Malek Daneshvarnezhad training and experience demonstrate that he meets the qualification requirements for a Radiation Safety Officer. [Documentation attached]

35.24(b) A licensee's management shall appoint a Radiation Safety Officer, who agrees, in writing, to be responsible for implementing the radiation protection program. The licensee, through the Radiation Safety Officer, shall ensure that radiation safety activities are being performed in accordance with licensee-approved procedures and regulatory requirements.[Delegation/Agreement attached]

35.24(e) A licensee shall establish the authority, duties, and responsibilities of the Radiation Safety Officer in writing. [Attached]

35.24(g) A licensee shall provide the Radiation Safety Officer sufficient authority, organizational freedom, time, resources, and management prerogative, to—[Delegation/Agreement attached]

- (1) Identify radiation safety problems;
- (2) Initiate, recommend, or provide corrective actions;
- (3) Stop unsafe operations; and,
- (4) Verify implementation of corrective actions.

35.24(h) A licensee shall retain a record of actions taken under paragraphs (b), and (e) of this section in accordance with § 35.2024.
