Enclosed is an application, dated April 16, 2012, received by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, from Transport Logistics International, Inc. requesting amendment No. 01 to its existing license, XSNM3704. The license presently authorizes the export to the Republic of Korea of 4,952.0 kgs U-235, contained in 104,264.0 kgs uranium enriched to 4.75 weight percent maximum, in the form of uranium hexafluoride (UF<sub>6</sub>). The purpose of the amendment is to add authorization for the shipment of Australian-obligated material.

Since no other changes to the terms and conditions of the existing license are requested, our office intends to issue this minor amendment after the 30-day time period allotted for public review expires and it is determined that applicable export license criteria are met.
