Dear Dr. Ramsay.

Enclosed is Amendment No. 05 to your NRC Material License No. 13-32719-01. This amendment is issued in accordance with your request, with the exception of the request to add Guy Kedziora, M.D., as an Authorized User for the use of Iridium-192 under 10 CFR 35.600, in a high dose rate remote afterloader unit. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in bold font. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

The submitted form indicates that Dr. Kedziora has completed a Board Certification, as required under 10 CFR 35.690(a). However, as we discussed by telephone, Dr. Kedziora's 1987 American Board of Radiology certification is not among the certifications recognized by the NRC, under 10 CFR 35.690. If you wish to add Dr. Kedziora to your license, at a later date, please resubmit your request. Include a completed NRC Form 313A (AUS), together with the appropriate preceptor attestations, including documentation that Dr. Kedziora meets the requirements listed in 10 CFR 35.690(b)(1), 35.35.690(b)(2), and 35.690(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 Code of Federal Regulations 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.
