Enclosed is Amendment No. 42 to your NRC Material License No. 13-13144-02. This amendment is issued in accordance with your request, **with the exception of the requests to add 10 CFR 35.400 and 35.600 authorizations for the new Authorized User Sea Chen, M.D.** Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.


We were unable to add the 10 CFR 35.600 authorization for Dr. Chen because that material is not authorized under your license. We could not add the 10 CFR 35.400 authorization because the submitted NRC Forms 313A (AUS) included a preceptor attestation and referenced supervision by Katherine Griem, Illinois License No. IL-01766-01. No documentation was provided supporting Ms. Griem's status as an Authorized User under that referenced license. If you wish to add a 10 CFR 35.400 authorization for Dr. Chen to your license at a later date, please resubmit your request. Include a completed Form 313A (AUS), together with attestations by an appropriately qualified preceptor.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

Note that the NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture. We strongly encourage you to review this material and adapt it to your particular needs in order to develop and maintain a positive safety culture as you engage in NRC-regulated activities.
