Construction Information: Bldg 92 is a single story, brick building added to the northeast wing of Bldg 1 in 1954 as Nuclear Medicine Clinic. Had direct entrance into the basement level of Bldg 1.

- RCOPCs: The HPO has no records of RAM use in Bldg 92. RAM use likely ceased in or before 1977 (year Bldg 2 opened). Therefore, nuclides typically used in nuclear medicine and imaging, with half-lives greater than 5 years, should be considered as potentially present.
