The on-going events at Fukushima demonstrate that nuclear power disasters can have sustained and far reaching effects. Effects that cannot be contained. Fukushima Chernobyl show that a ten mile evacuation zone is insufficient. As much as 80% of the airborne radiation released at Fukushima blew directly over the Pacific Ocean, rather than populated areas a few miles away. The people of the United States cannot rely on favorable wind patterns to protect us.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission should adopt the proposed rule expanding emergency planning zones to 25, 50, and 100 mile zones.
