SUBJECT: MEETING BETWEEN THE NUCLEAR REGULATORY
COMMISSION STAFF AND STAKEHOLDERS
CONCERNING DRAFT NUREG-1022, REVISION 3.

On May 24, 2012, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff met with members of the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), as well as with other members of industry, to discuss Draft NUREG-1022, Revision 3. NUREG-1022 is titled "Event Reporting Guidelines 10 CFR 50.72 and 50.73." The NRC has received comments on the draft NUREG and the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the NRC's tentative disposition of the comments received.

A public meeting notice was issued on April 17, 2012, and was posted on the NRC's external (public) web page (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML12110A219).

MEETING ATTENDEE LIST

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MEETING SUMMARY

- The NRC provided an update NUREG-1022, Revision 3 (see Attachment 1).
- The NRC then discussed the tentative disposition of the external comments received on Draft NUREG-1022, Revision 3 (see Attachment 2).
- Outstanding items from the meeting include the following:
 - Section 3.2.1, “Plant Shutdown Required by Technical Specifications.” NEI / Industry requested that the first Question in Example 3 be revised to “Question: What about the situation where you have 7 days to fix a component required to be operable in Technical Specifications or be shut down, but the plant must be shut down to fix the component?” There was a concern that perhaps the Example may be applied to non-TS systems or to TS systems not in a Mode of Applicability. The NRC indicated it would consider the request and provide an update to stakeholders.
 - Section 3.2.2, “Operation or Condition Prohibited by Technical Specifications.” Based on feedback from internal stakeholders, the NRC indicated it would add an Example addressing situations in which TS allow 30 days for a licensee to receive results of a charcoal sample. The NRC will provide an update to stakeholders after the Example is created.
 - Section 3.2.12, “News Release or Notification of Other Government Agency.” Based on feedback from internal stakeholders, the NRC indicated it would provide additional guidance on the reportability of cyber security events. The NRC will provide an update to stakeholders after the guidance is created.
 - Section 3.2.13, “Loss of Emergency Preparedness Capabilities.” For “Loss of Emergency Assessment Capability,” “Loss of Offsite Response Capability,” and “Loss of Offsite Communications Capability,” the NRC will provide stakeholders with additional details on reporting guidance with respect to how / if preplanned activities differ from unplanned losses.
 - External stakeholders requested that there be no need to undertake “look-back” reviews for previously identified conditions. The NRC is still considering the feasibility of the request and will provide an update to stakeholders.
- The NRC indicated it would notify stakeholders of any changes to the disposition of the comments.
- The NRC indicated that NUREG-1022, Revision 3 will be published in September 2012, with implementation to occur in January 2013.
