SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Ackermann:

This refers to the inspection conducted by the NRC Region II office on August 7, 1996. The inspection included a review of activities being performed at Pensacola, Florida. The purpose of the inspection was to determine whether activities authorized by the license were conducted safely and in accordance with NRC requirements. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with Mr. Richard E. Haoglin, Branch Manager of your facility.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, independent measurements, and observation of activities in progress.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that a violation of NRC requirements occurred. The violation is cited in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). It has been determined that your corrective actions taken in response to this violation, including submission of an amendment request in order to change the Radiation Protection Officer listed on your license, are adequate. Therefore, a written response is not required.

A violation of Condition 10 of your license regarding storage of radioactive material at an unauthorized site at Pensacola Naval Air Station was discussed with your staff at the time of inspection. However, the authorization for use at temporary field sites in the United States specified in License Condition 10 of your byproduct license includes storage at this location. Therefore, no violation of NRC requirements has occurred.

No other deficiencies in the implementation of the radiation safety program at this facility were identified.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and the enclosure will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room (PDR).

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NOTICE OF VIOLATION

During an NRC inspection conducted on August 7, 1996, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," NUREG-1600 (60 FR 34381, dated June 30, 1995), the violation is listed below:

Condition 12 of License No. 12-16941-01, states that the Radiation Protection Officer for the activities authorized by this license is the named individual.

Contrary to the above, between August 1 and August 7, 1996, the individual named as the Radiation Protection Officer for the activities authorized by the license was not functioning in that capacity, in that he had terminated employment with the licensee on August 1, 1996.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

We have reviewed your corrective actions, which appear to be adequate. Consequently, no reply to this violation is required and we have no further questions regarding this matter at this time.
