By Reference 1, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff issued the cited request for information. Enclosure 5 of Reference 1 contains specific Requested Actions and Requested Information associated with Recommendation 9.3 for Emergency Preparedness (EP) programs. Addressees were requested to submit a written response in accordance with 10 CFR 50.54(f) to the information requests.

By Reference 2 (Letter L-2012-208), Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) submitted its 60-day response for the Turkey Point Nuclear Generating Station (Turkey Point) Units 3 and 4 with its proposed alternative course of action, including the basis of the acceptability of the proposed alternative course of action and estimated completion date.

This letter is to clarify dates provided in the response. The second refueling outage, as used in the context of NRC Order EA-12-049, cited in Reference 2 is the Turkey Point Unit 3 Refueling Outage 28 (RFO 28) currently planned for the Spring of 2015.

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There are no regulatory commitments contained in this letter.
