Per our phone conversation today, attached is your invitation to comment on the mitigation stipulations in our draft MOA, but since Monroe County Community College is already involved in setting up the exhibit, this letter is basically a formality. If you have no objections to Stipulations I and II, could you please indicate in your reply to this e-mail that you do not have comments on the MOA stipulations (or list any comments that you do have)?

Also, regarding the planned tour of Fermi 1 (at 1:00 pm on Friday, December 2, 2011), please contact Randy Westmoreland, Fermi 3 Environmental Manager [phone: 313-235-3368] at Detroit Edison if you plan to attend. Regarding sharing the Fermi 1 documents in your archives, you can contact either Mr. Westmoreland or Dr. David Nixon, President of Monroe County Community College (MCCC) [phone: (734) 242-7300 or e-mail: [dnixon@monroeccc.edu](mailto:dnixon@monroeccc.edu)]. Dr. Nixon said the college is very enthusiastic about hosting the Fermi 1 exhibit. It would go in the lobby of the new Career Technology Center, which will have a Nuclear Technology Program. Mr. Westmoreland said a committee (composed of at least one former Fermi 1 employee and representatives of various college disciplines) has been set up by Sue Wetzel, MCCC's VP of Administration, to decide what the exhibit will contain and how it will look. He said no specific decisions have been made yet, but these exhibit components are being discussed:

- continuous loop films
- oral histories (recordings) from former Fermi employees
- paintings
- signatures of visiting dignitaries
- parts of the control room
- photos, diagrams, drawings, etc.

Mr. Westmoreland said the Fermi 1 library has extensive documents and memorabilia.

In your reply to this e-mail, would you please indicate whether you plan to share your Fermi 1 documents with MCCC and Detroit Edison to enhance Fermi 1's recordation and exhibit?
