Dear Mr. Booth:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 06 renewing your NRC Material License No. 21-20174-01 in accordance with your request.

In addition, Subitem B of License Condition 12 with regard to the future RSO and Subitems B and D of Condition 13 with regard to the sealed source leak test exemptions have been removed. Please note that you must request and obtain a license amendment before you change the RSO. Also, we have removed License Condition 24 with regard to the decommissioning financial assurance requirement because this condition is not applicable to your program based on the possession limit on the license.

Lastly, it has come to our attention that an error existed in Amendment No. 05 to your NRC license issued on November 20, 2009. This error has been corrected by the revising of License Condition 17. The changes appear in bold font.


Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture. We strongly encourage you to review this material and adapt it to your particular needs in order to develop and maintain a positive safety culture as you engage in NRC-regulated activities.
