Dear CAPT Davis-Urgo:

The Region I Field Office, NRC Office of Investigations (OI) initiated an investigation (Case No. 1-2011-041) on May 11, 2011, to determine whether a radiographer at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard was discriminated against for engaging in NRC protected activity for having reported a safety/compliance concern to management. Based on testimonial and documentary evidence developed by OI, the NRC was unable to substantiate the concern. The NRC concluded that the discipline received by the radiographer was unrelated to a protected activity.

Please note that final NRC investigation documents, such as the OI report described above, may be made available to the public under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) subject to redaction of information appropriate under the FOIA. Requests under the FOIA should be made in accordance with 10 CFR 9.23, Requests for Records, a copy of which is enclosed for your information.
