- Clear, consistent, and transparent comment adjudication process



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
Defining Success

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Scope of Revision

- Update existing guidance to reflect the current emergency preparedness environment, approaches, and concepts
- Incorporate the various supplements and other agency guidance that were developed to support NRC EP rule changes
- Resolve divergences between the FEMA REP Program Manual and the recent NRC EP rule changes



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Enhancement Areas

All of the current 16 planning standards and their associated sub-criteria will fit into 8 Enhancement Areas.

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General Revision Process



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Federal Guidance Process

- Federal, State, local, tribal, and licensee stakeholder public meetings and input
- Review of stakeholder input
- Draft Rev. 2 document development
- Internal (NRC/FEMA HQ and regions) review and comment period
- Draft Rev. 2 document re-write/adjustments



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Federal Guidance Process

- Legal review/concurrence of draft Rev. 2 document
- FEMA/NRC leadership review/concurrence of draft Rev. 2 document
- FRN for initial distribution of draft Rev. 2 document for formal public comment
- Formal public comment period
- Comment adjudication
- Additional Comment period if needed



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Federal Guidance Process

- Final documents to FEMA/NRC leadership and OMB/ACRS/OCC/OGC for review/concurrence
- Development of implementation training/public meetings
- Create FRN for final documents
- Issue final documents
- Conduct training/public meetings for stakeholders
