The second corrected copy was issued because of an error identified in Amendment No. 132, issued on May 1, 2012, in that one of the requests made in your letter dated March 5, 2012, was not addressed. Your request to add Phillip C. Lee, M.D. as an authorized user for materials in 10 CFR 35.200 was inadvertently not included in the amendment. It was reviewed and it was the reviewer's intention (mine) to authorize Dr. Lee; it simply was missed in the final preparation of the amendment.

We apologize for the error and for any inconvenience it may have caused you.
