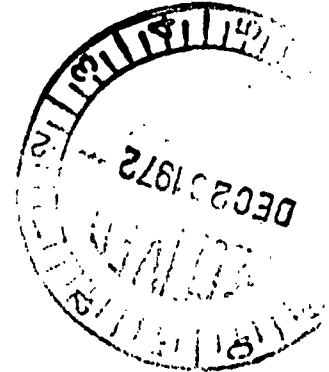
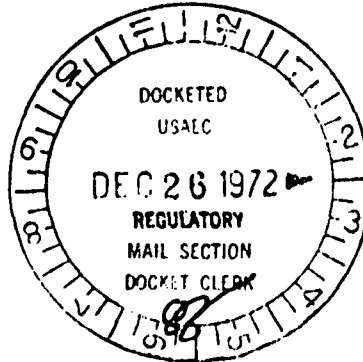

Dear Mr. Malaro:

Effective on January 1, 1973, Humble Oil and Refining Company will merge into its parent corporation. On that date all of the rights, assets, and liabilities of Humble will accrue to and be assumed by Exxon Corporation.

All of the business, properties, assets, and liabilities of Humble will be operated and managed by Exxon Company, U.S.A. (a division of Exxon Corporation).

This notice is furnished to you in connection with:

- (1) Humble's application for a Source Material License for the Highland Uranium Mill, and the interim authorization to operate that mill (Docket No. 40-8102).
- (2) Source Material License No. SUA-1064, authorizing experimental in-situ uranium leaching and refining activities in Converse County, Wyoming.

We request amendment of the above documents to substitute the name "Exxon Company, U.S.A." for the name "Humble Oil and Refining Company," effective on January 1, 1973.

After January 1, 1973, all notices or other communications which were previously sent to Humble should be sent to Exxon Company, U.S.A. at the same addresses as those used by Humble.

We would appreciate your cooperation in helping us make these changes, and we assure you that our policies and our business relationships with you will remain the same. The responsibilities of individuals named in our license applications and subsequent correspondence will not change as a result of the merger.
